O R D E R

Appellant Karna, pro se, filed his *Petition for Review* on September 4, 2025. On September 22, 2025, Appellant filed in this Court *Opening Brief - Appellant's Jurisdictional Discovery*. On September 24, 2025, this Court entered an order advising, "Discovery is governed by the trial court in accordance with applicable court rules—not the appellate courts." In the September 24, 2025 order, this Court struck the *Opening Brief - Appellant's Jurisdictional Discovery* and explained that "The **Petition for review will be considered in due course.**" (Emphasis added.)

On January 5, 2026, the Court denied Appellant's *Petition for Review*.

On January 5, 2026 and January 12, 2026, Appellant filed two separate pleadings entitled, *Motion for Reconsideration and Motion to exceed the 20-Page Limit for Attached 43 Pages of Supplemental Brief*, and the Court entered an order on January 14, 2026 denying the

motions. The January 14, 2026 order specifically noted that "neither the *January 5 Motion* nor the *January 12 Motion* raise any challenge to the Court of Appeals' finding that the Court of Appeals, 'lacks jurisdiction to consider the above-entitled appeal as to the State Defendants.'" "

On January 14, 2026, Appellant filed a *Notice of Appeal*. Appellant argues that this Court "made no mention of Appellant Karna's Motion for Jurisdictional Discovery to the Court of Appeals." Appellant contends that because this Court failed to "consider the filings made to the Court of Appeals," he has "the basis for this notice of appeal for Writ of Certiorari to the United States Supreme Court."

On January 17, 2026, Appellant filed copies of various pleadings filed in the Court of Appeals, Division Two, including a *Motion for Jurisdictional Discovery* and repeated copies of documents including certificates of service, certificates of compliance, and fee deferrals. That same day, Appellant filed two separate documents, each entitled *Writ Outline and Draft Writ of Certiorari*. Appellant again contends that this Court "violated the September 24, 2025 Order because said Order of January 14, 2026 did not consider Appellant Karna's Motion for Jurisdictional Discovery submitted to the Arizona Supreme Court on September 4, 2025."

As this Court previously advised Appellant, discovery matters are addressed by the trial courts and not the appellate courts.

Having considered the Petition for Review, the Court has therefore addressed all matters properly presented in this Court. Therefore,

**IT IS ORDERED** denying the Appellants' requests filed on January 14, 2026 and thereafter, without prejudice to filing an application to the United States Supreme Court for a writ of certiorari.

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** directing the Clerk of Court to reject any further filings in this case except for a timely request to stay the mandate as authorized by Rule 24(d) of the Arizona Rules of Civil Appellate Procedure.
