MOTION FOR LEAVE TO PROCEED IN FORMA PAUPERIS

Petitioner, Gerson Armando Romero Salazar, an indigent party in this case, moves for leave to proceed in forma pauperis for the purpose of filing a Petition for Writ of Certiorari.

Petitioner's financial indigency was recognized by the United States Court of Appeals for the Tenth Circuit, which on March 20, 2025, appointed the Office of Federal Public Defender identified below to represent Petitioner pursuant to the Criminal Justice Act (18 U.S.C. §3006A).
