**ORDER**

Upon consideration of the motion for summary reversal, it is

**ORDERED** that the motion be denied and, on the court's own motion, that the district court's dismissal of appellant's complaint be summarily affirmed. Appellant's filing of a motion for summary reversal placed the merits of this appeal before the court. Because the appropriate disposition is so clear, summary action is warranted. See Taxpayers Watchdog, Inc. v. Stanley, 819 F.2d 294, 297 (D.C. Cir. 1987) (per curiam). The district court did not abuse its discretion in dismissing appellant's complaint where appellant twice refused to comply with court orders, that refusal continued even after the district court warned appellant that such refusal could result in dismissal, the district court afforded appellant an opportunity to explain his failure to comply, and appellant failed adequately to do so. See Bristol Petroleum Corp. v. Harris, 901 F.2d 165, 167-68 (D.C. Cir. 1990).
