I am writing on behalf of the intervenor respondents in the above-referenced case. The petition for a writ of certiorari was filed on January 20, 2026, and responses are currently due on February 23, 2026. Pursuant to Rule 30.4 of the Rules of this Court, intervenor respondents request an extension of time of 60 days, to and including April 24, 2026, for the filing of all respondents' responses to the petition.

The requested extension is warranted to accommodate professional obligations in other matters and to enable all intervenor respondents—which include state and municipal governmental entities—to join in a single consolidated brief that presents the relevant issues in a manner that is most helpful to the Court.
