**APPLICATION TO THE HONORABLE ELENA KAGAN
FOR A BRIEF EXTENSION OF TIME WITHIN WHICH TO FILE
A PETITION FOR A WRIT OF CERTIORARI**

TO THE HON. ELENA KAGAN

Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 13(5), Applicant-Petitioner, Moneesha Kamani (“Kamani”), through undersigned counsel, respectfully moves for a brief extension of, approximately a month up to and including Monday, May 11, 2026, within which to file a petition for a writ of certiorari. Absent an extension, the current deadline for filing the petition is April 7, 2026.

In support of this request, Applicant-Petitioner states as follows:

1. Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1257(a) and 2101(c) and Rules 13(5) and 30 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of the United States, this application is

respectfully made for a brief extension of time within which to file a petition for a writ of certiorari. The judgment sought to be reviewed was entered by the Washington Supreme Court on January 7, 2026, denying review. Under U.S.C. § 1257(a), this Court has jurisdiction to review the federal question presented in a final judgment.

2. Undersigned counsel has been actively pursuing admission to practice before the Supreme Court of the United States. The application was submitted to the Court on March 17, 2026. On March 24, 2026, counsel was advised that one of her sponsors was not admitted. That sponsor believes they were admitted to the bar in 2019 and would be consulting with their firm regarding the issue. Upon consultation with a Court Case Manager, to avoid potential procedural defects and to ensure full compliance with the Court's admission requirements, additional time is requested to either obtain this or an alternate sponsor's signature.
3. This extension is also requested in light of counsel's professional obligations across multiple jurisdictions. Counsel, who performs work in multiple states and is admitted to the bars of Texas and Ohio. In addition, counsel learned that a contractor assisting with finalizing this petition for filing has been unwell, necessitating additional time to complete the filing. The requested additional weeks will provide a reasonable buffer to address these logistical barriers.

4. This is the first request for an extension of time. The request is timely, modest, and made in good faith. Granting the extension will allow counsel sufficient time to complete the admission process to the Supreme Court bar and to finalize the petition.

WHEREFORE, for the foregoing reasons, Applicant-Petitioner respectfully requests that an extension of time to and including May 11, 2026, be granted within which to file a petition for a writ of certiorari.
