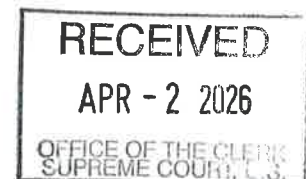

**JOINT PRO SE APPLICATION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME
WITHIN WHICH TO FILE A PETITION FOR A WRIT OF CERTIORARI**

TO THE HONORABLE CHIEF JUSTICE OF THE UNITED STATES:

Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 13.5, Petitioners Oliver Jenkins and Sherry-Ann Jenkins, both proceeding pro se, respectfully apply for an extension of time within which to file a petition for a writ of certiorari to the United States Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit.



1. The Judgment Sought to Be Reviewed

Petitioners seek review of the judgment of the United States Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit in Case No. 23-3820, affirming their convictions on October 17, 2025. A timely petition for rehearing was filed. The petition for rehearing was denied on December 8, 2025.

2. The Applicable Deadline

Under Supreme Court Rule 13.3, the time within which to file a petition for a writ of certiorari runs from the date of the denial of a timely petition for rehearing. The petition for rehearing was denied on December 8, 2025. Ninety days from December 8, 2025 is Sunday, March 8, 2026. Under Supreme Court Rule 30.1, the deadline automatically extends to the next business day — Monday, March 9, 2026. This application was postmarked March 4, 2026, five days before the operative deadline.

3. Grounds for Extension

Good cause exists for an extension of time. Petitioner Sherry-Ann Jenkins, Ph.D., is currently incarcerated at FPC Alderson, Alderson, West Virginia. The physical separation of the two pro se petitioners — one at liberty in Georgia and one in federal custody in West Virginia — has made the coordination of signatures, review of documents, and preparation of the joint petition logistically challenging. Additional time is necessary to allow both petitioners to review, finalize, and execute the joint petition for writ of certiorari.

4. Length of Extension Requested

Petitioners respectfully request an extension of 60 days from March 9, 2026, to and including May 8, 2026, within which to file the joint pro se petition for a writ of certiorari.

5. Statement of Pro Se Status

Both Petitioners are proceeding entirely pro se. Oliver Jenkins signs this application on his own behalf. Sherry-Ann Jenkins signs this application on her own behalf. Neither petitioner is

represented by counsel admitted to practice before this Court. This application is not filed in any representative capacity.
