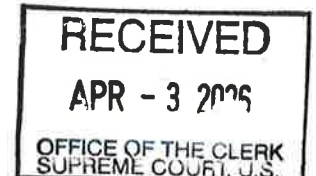

**APPLICATION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME IN WHICH TO FILE
PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI**

TO THE HONORABLE JOHN G. ROBERTS, JR., CHIEF JUSTICE OF THE
UNITED STATES AND CIRCUIT JUSTICE FOR THE ELEVENTH CIRCUIT:

NOW COMES petitioner, Alberta Rose Josephine Jones, pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 13.5, and respectfully requests a sixty-day extension of time for filing a petition for a writ of certiorari from the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit Court, such extension to include June 11, 2026. This application is submitted more than ten (10) days prior to the scheduled filing date for said Writ of Certiorari, which is March 13, 2026. In support of this application, petitioner shows the following:

The final judgment of the Federal Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit was entered on January 13, 2026 (Exhibit (A)), and absent an extension, the petition would be due on March 13, 2026.

This request is made in good faith and not for purposes of delay. Additional time is necessary due to the complexity of the legal issues, the need to review federal case laws and issues surrounding the complexities involved in the filing of a booklet form brief which cannot be printed on any personal printers currently on the market for personal home or office use. The paper required for a writ of certiorari is difficult to be printed on a Hewlett Packard printer purchased for personal or home office usage due to weight of the paper required by the United States Supreme Court which is heavier and thicker than paper sold for normal home printers.

“Booklet-format petitions for a writ of certiorari in the United States Supreme Court must be printed on opaque, unglazed, white paper that is at least 60 pounds in weight. The cover must be 65-pound weight paper.”

Granting this extension will allow for the preparation of a well-supported petition for the Court’s consideration.

If granted, the new filing deadline would be should be June 11, 2026.

WHEREFORE, petitioner respectfully requests that an order be entered extending the time for filing a petition for a writ of certiorari in this matter to and including June 11, 2026.
