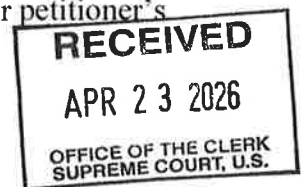

**APPLICATION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME IN WHICH TO FILE
PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI**

TO THE HONORABLE CLARENCE THOMAS, ASSOCIATE JUSTICE OF THE
UNITED STATES:

NOW COMES petitioner, Alberta Rose Josephine Jones, pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 13.5, and respectfully requests an additional thirty day extension of time for filing a petition for a writ of certiorari from the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit Court, such extension to include June 11, 2026. This application is submitted more than ten (10) days prior to the scheduled filing date for said Writ of Certiorari, which is May 13, 2026. In support of this application, petitioner presents the following:

This request is made in good faith and not for purposes of delay. Additional time is necessary due to receiving the attached email from the Eleventh Circuit Court of Appeals on April 16, 2026 in regards to receiving a free copy of the file from Pacer.gov for petitioner's writ of certiorari.

Petitioner further requests an exception to the filing of her writ of certiorari in booklet form per Court Rule 33 which states as follows:

(c) Every booklet-format document shall be produced on paper that is opaque, unglazed, 6 1/8 by 9 1/4 inches in size, and not less than **60 pounds in weight**, and shall have margins of at least three fourths of an inch on all sides. The text field, including footnotes, should be approximately 4 1/8 by 7 1/8 inches.

The **cover** (if used) must be **65-pound weight paper** in the color indicated in Rule 33.1(g)(i).

Petitioner is able to produce the number of copies to be presented but the difficulty for her as a “pro-se” petitioner is the weight of the paper for “copying” on a personal home printer and the cost of the card stock paper - 60 pounds in weight and the 65 pounds respectfully.

As a “pro-se” litigant who is not indigent, the cost of producing the booklet format writ of certiorari is “cost prohibitive” and extremely “time consuming.”

The writ of certiorari in booklet form on 60 and 65 pound paper far exceeds petitioner’s filing fee of \$300.00.

Petitioner is a disabled veteran with medical issues which has impaired her ability to complete such a complicated booklet on a limited budget. If petition must file her writ of certiorari in booklet form which is not an issue excluding the type of paper required, petitioner respectfully requests an exception to the type of paper being mandated and additional time for proper completion after being notified that she is entitled to one free pacer copy of the file.

Petitioner wishes to address the court concerning a legal term applied in her case from the Eleventh Circuit Court of Appeals i.e. “shotgun pleadings.” The United States Supreme Court has not been presented with such a writ of certiorari. “The U.S. Supreme Court has not issued a standalone opinion specifically defining or ruling on “shotgun pleadings,” but it has upheld

lower court rulings that dismiss such pleadings when they fail to meet the requirements of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure.” <https://www.bing.com/search?>

Petitioner additionally wishes to address the court concerning known discrepancies in the federal courts and a “pro se” litigants ability to “e-file.” A 2022 **Federal Judicial Center (FJC) study** examined how federal courts handle electronic filing by self-represented litigants, identifying both opportunities and barriers.

Granting this extension will allow for the preparation of a well-supported petition for the Court’s consideration.

If granted, the new filing deadline would be June 11, 2026.

WHEREFORE, petitioner respectfully requests that an order be entered extending the time for filing a petition for a writ of certiorari in this matter to and including June 11, 2026.
