**MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME
TO PAY DOCKETING FEE AND FILE PETITION
IN COMPLIANCE WITH RULE 33.1**

Petitioner Vincent Terry respectfully moves this Court for an extension of time within which to comply with the Court's Order dated April 6, 2026. In support of this motion, Petitioner states as follows:

1. Court's April 6, 2026 Order

On April 6, 2026, this Court entered an order denying Petitioner's motion for leave to proceed in forma pauperis. The Court further ordered that Petitioner is allowed until April 27, 2026, within which to pay the docketing fee required by Rule 38(a) and submit a petition in compliance with Rule 33.1 of the Rules of this Court.

2. Need for Additional Time

Petitioner respectfully requests additional time to comply with the Court's order. The preparation of a petition in compliance with Rule 33.1 requires reformatting the petition into booklet format, printing the required number of copies, arranging professional printing and binding, securing funds to pay the docketing fee, and coordinating mailing and service requirements.

Petitioner is proceeding pro se and requires additional time to complete these requirements in compliance with this Court's rules.

3. Good Cause Exists

Good cause exists for the requested extension because the Court's order requires conversion from IFP format to Rule 33.1 booklet format, professional printing and binding services must be arranged, Petitioner must secure funds for the docketing fee and printing costs, and additional time is necessary to ensure full compliance with Rule 33.1. This request is made in good faith and not for purposes of delay.

4. Requested Extension

Petitioner respectfully requests an extension of 30 days, up to and including May 27, 2026, within which to pay the docketing fee required by Rule 38(a) and file a petition in compliance with Rule 33.1.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner Vincent Terry respectfully requests that this Court grant an extension of time up to and including May 27, 2026, to pay the docketing fee and submit a petition in compliance with Rule 33.1.
