REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TIME
TO FILE PETITION FOR A WRIT OF
CERTIORARI


The relator, Jeffrey L. Clemens, in regards to matters before the Ohio Supreme Court that saw final judgment on February 25, 2026, and given that said court had original jurisdiction to hear those matters, does hereby request an extension of sixty (60) days (from what would be a May 25, 2026 deadline) to file a petition for a writ of certiorari addressing the errors and omissions of said court as it addressed Due Process issues in an underlying - at the time open - criminal case, No. 2A000354 AB at the Ottawa County (Ohio) Municipal Court, Port Clinton, Ohio. Such case saw a bench trial in 2025 before a magistrate judge (Boldt) whom, as it was argued in an Application for a Writ of Mandamus (filed with the Ohio Supreme Court last fall), failed to comply with his duties and obligations set forth in Ohio Rules of Civil Procedure Rule 53.

Given the relative frequency of magistrate decisions (to include verdicts in misdemeanor criminal trials) within the United States, the case at hand has implications of national import as Fairness and Due Process shall and must be maintained in state courts every bit as much as in Federal courts.

As Fate and Irony would have it, however, the relator is currently incarcerated (at the Erie County (Ohio) jail) related to charges - Failure to Obey Order of a Police Officer - stemming from a January 8, 2026 traffic stop out of which a bench warrant was executed, one which was generated within the criminal proceedings reviewed by the Ohio Supreme Court making this an ever more important matter. An extension is needed to help assure a fair review of a matter before a state supreme court that itself had original jurisdiction to hear, thus opening way for potential review by the U.S. Supreme Court, the ultimate and final arbiter of disputes in all of our nation's courts

The relator anticipates a bond review and release on June 8, 2026 at a hearing now currently scheduled and after which the relator will have access to resources enabling him to petition this court per its rules.
