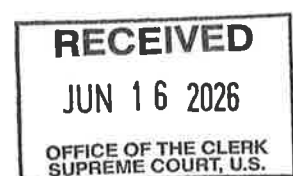

**To the HONORABLE JUSTICE NEAL GORSUCH assigned to the TENTH CIRCUIT:**

Comes now APPLICANT, DONNA BRANDILYN MESSINGER, and respectfully requests an extension of time within which to file a PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI seeking review of proceedings arising from; first the personal employment interruption and whistleblower circumstance forced upon her; mishandling of State funding and employment law by a public entity and former employer (Chrysalis, LLC - entrusted to provide oversight and care for the mentally and physically disabled in Utah), the resulting resignation and misapplication of Utah State law affecting Applicant's employment and personal recovery ability (four instances in



the matter) inconsistent processes and benefits denial by the department UWFS, related Utah State Court due process curtailment and ALJ denials, and finally Utah Court rulings ultimately denying Applicant's overall civil liberties in an obvious chain of corruption and abuse enabled, climaxing when evidence of misinformation provided by Google, - *a publicly sourced online information system base - offered an incorrect filing deadline - despite 'strategic' wording in State ALJ UWFS explanations navigated - as an overall 'means' for denying the obvious corrections needed for the general good including denying the Applicant's Constitutional Rights (as WELL as her ability to **also** advocate for the 'handicapped' former clients (2); one (RG) being 'ward of the State of Utah')*

## HISTORY

1. Applicant reported on eight occasions, with evidences, to upper Chrysalis LLC management signs of obvious increasing abuse upon her two clients between December 2024 to March 8, 2025.
2. Applicant resigned because the employer failed to act. Under the circumstance, this constituted 'constructive discharge' in Utah.
3. Applicant was ultimately denied both reassignment and benefits. Ruled 'disqualifying reason' for resignation by Utah DWFS, while Chrysalis claimed her client concern was 'unsubstantiated.'
4. Further legal action after reporting to authorities was denied by Logan city attorney.
5. Applicant contends administrative procedures prevented full presentation of evidence, due process, fairness and correct 'application of law' when seeking short term unemployment benefit.
6. Applicant suffered severe financial consequences midst the increasing burden of righting 'wrongs' in Utah's ongoing denials in legal action/her human obligation.
7. Applicant seeks Federal Supreme Court review of all employment matters arising in her history with Chrysalis, LLC as well as State and Federal actions or lack thereof, and 'due-process' issues in this matter. And any relating matters or patterns of Utah legal curiosities.

## GOOD CAUSE FOR THIS REQUEST

1. Applicant recently relocated from Utah to Idaho out of necessity to 'continue' and currently lacks access to substantial portions of the documentary record relevant to the proceedings and seeks to preserve the record. Important records, correspondence, and evidence remain in storage in Logan, Utah, and Applicant presently lacks the financial means necessary to retrieve and review those materials within the deadline, as she has only recently obtained new employment which begins June 12, 2026, two days post U.S. SUPREME COURT filing deadline.
2. The underlying matter involves multiple administrative and judicial proceeding failures of law and rights and currently including in this serious matter:
  - a. reports of alleged abuse involving vulnerable disabled individuals;
  - b. communications provable with employer management concerning abuse reporting;
  - c. unemployment-benefit proceedings;
  - d. administrative appeals;
  - e. appellate proceedings before Utah courts.
3. Applicant believes the matter presents substantial federal questions involving procedural due process, misapplication of State law, access to a meaningful opportunity to be heard, and the handling of evidence and appeals within State administrative and judicial proceedings. Also, the mishandling of State funding within a registered business, midst personal harm imposed, and ultimately the use of publicly sourced information relied upon for accuracy and how it applies to legal processes.
4. Applicant has acted diligently throughout these proceedings and seeks this extension in good faith, not for purposes of delay.

5. Additional time is necessary to:
  - a. obtain and review records currently inaccessible due to financial hardship and forced situation of vulnerability ongoing since Utah Court injustices and system actions imposed outside of this record but pertinent to current request, dating back to foreign travel of 2016 and especially exasperated with the leveraging of Applicant's minor child and injustices of 2017, subsequent 'efforts' to cover civil rights denials moved against her good efforts and citizenship to-date,
  - b. organize the procedural history;
  - c. identify and articulate the federal questions presented;
  - d. prepare a petition that accurately reflects the record.
  
6. Applicant is appreciative for the opportunity to bring this matter to the attention and integrity of the U.S. Federal Courts.

WHEREFORE, Applicant respectfully requests that the Court grant an extension of time to file a fair and accurate PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI.

Additionally, Applicant survived on less than \$1600.00 in total gross earnings last year, a victim of digital and system manipulations.

At this time as she advocates for herself and former clients in this matter, again she her rights are leveraged by a system that is now requiring cell phone service in order to send timely mail to the Court. Or in other words, because she has not been able to restore even a simple cell phone number and service in months, has been positioned to need a Plasma Donation payout in order to even file an extension in this matter, it is likely this filing needing the Courts attention will not arrive on time. Applicant will file for the record regardless. Applicant asserts that the company Chrysalis was satisfied with her performance, often covering for other co-workers shifts, at the time of resignation. Applicant would request the Court and Judge take a good look at what is required to maintain healthy living in a society such as this for an independent individual without others to 'fall back on.' Midst a digital age where integrity is easily undermined. Lastly, Applicant asks if the law and Consitutional Rights actually still exist?

Applicant has not had others to 'fall back on.' It would seem this has been the goal of some. Applicant will stand in her integrity and on this legal matter regardless.
