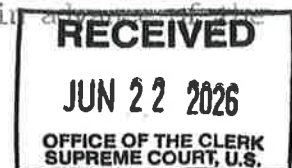

MOTION FOR EXTENSION

COME NOW, BRAD JOSEPH ROBERTS in pro se, and files this motion for an extension of time to file his writ of certiorari, 60 days, from the denial of his state court's direct appeal determination on March 25, 2026, pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 30, for the following reasons:

1. The Supreme Court of Virginia refused Petitioner's direct appeal on March 25, 2026. (Appendix A).
2. That Petitioner is now moving forward pro se to file his writ of certiorari.
3. That Petitioner is allowed limited access to the law library at Haynesville Correctional Center for institutional reasons.
4. That Petitioner has little understanding in law and procedures of this Court, as well as shepardizing and developing an appropriate argument before this Honorable Court.
5. That Petitioner's issues are complex and needs additional time to study the specific area of law.
6. Petitioner was only recently transferred to the Virginia Department of Corrections in December, 2025, and spent 5 months in receiving without access to the law library.

THEREFORE, for good cause showing, Petitioner/ Appellant moves this Honorable SUPREME COURT of the UNITED STATES to grant him an extension of 60 days from June 23, 2026, to file his writ of certiorari being that this request is made 10 days in advance of the



June 23, 2026, 90 days time limit.

FROM THE COURT OF APPEALS OF VIRGINIA

On June 12, 2025, came court-appointed counsel and by motion requested leave to withdraw. The Court, finding that counsel has complied with the requirements of *Anders v. California*, 386 U.S. 738 (1967), in filing the requisite brief and in furnishing the appellant with a copy thereof, hereby grants the motion to withdraw.

The Court, upon further consideration of the entire record, finds no legal issues arguable on their merits and therefore refuses the petition for appeal without appointment of additional counsel.

The Circuit Court of Isle of Wight County shall allow court-appointed counsel the fee set forth below and also counsel's necessary direct out-of-pocket expenses. And it is ordered that the Commonwealth recover of the appellant the costs in this Court and in the courts below.

Upon consideration whereof, appellant's pending requests and all relief requested therein are denied.
