MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE PETITION FOR A WRIT OF CERTIORARI

- 1. Due to extenuating circumstances, and Pursuant to Rule 13.5 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of the United States, Petitioner Harry Barnett respectfully requests an 11-day extension of time, up to and including October 11th, 2025, within which to file a petition for a writ of certiorari for cases: 23-2509 in the 7th Circuit U.S. Court of Appeals and 23-12517 in the 11th Circuit Court of Appeals.
- 2. Petitioner had a death in the family on September 21st. The funeral and sitting Shivah, which are a traditional Jewish ceremonies, are on September 24th. (Exhibit A)
- 3. Petitioner will not be able to complete his Writ, and have it printed in booklet form, due to the time he has spent with family, and the time for the funeral and Shivah.
- 4. Barnett requested and was granted a 49-day extension for Barnett v. Kulisek, 7th Circuit U.S. Court of Appeal case: 23-2509. Including this request of 11-days, totals the 60-day maximum of Rule 13.5.
- 5. The Writ also includes Barnett v. Elsmore 11th Circuit U.S. Court of Appeal case: 23-12517, with a deadline of September 30, 2025, which was the reason for the 49-day Motion for Extension in Barnett v. Kulisek, to align with Elsmore. This is the only extension for Elsmore in this case, and is only for 11-days.
- 6. Additionally, Petitioner contacted a computer-tech that Petitioner contacted weeks back, and was relying upon to convert/alter PDF's for the Appendix so they will fit the format required for a Writ, and that person is now out of their office until September 28th, making the completion of the printing of the Writ near impossible by the September 30th current due date.
- 7. As stated in the prior Motion for Extension, both cases involve, but are not limited to, Fourth Amendment malicious prosecution claims, with a circuit split between the Seventh

and Eleventh Circuits as to the viability and elements required of a claim, and thereby is of national importance.

- 8. This court has jurisdiction based upon 28 U.S.C. § 1651 as the two lower Courts are U.S. District Courts, and entered judgments in these matters.
- 9. This is the second and final request for an extension of time in Kulisek, and the first and only for Elsmore.

CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, Petitioner prays this Honorable Court extends the time to file a petition for a writ of certiorari in Kulisek by 11 days to the maximum 60-days, and Elsmore for 11-days, up to and including October 11, 2025, so one writ may be filed for both cases.


