MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE PETITIONER FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI

To the Honorable Clerk of the Supreme Court of the United States:

Pursuant to Rule 13.5 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of the United States, Petitioner respectfully requests a sixty (60) day extension of time, to and including October 24, 2025, in which to file a Petition for Writ of Certiorari in the Honorable High Court.

1. Date of Lower Court Decision:

The United States Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit issued its final order denying relief on May 27, 2025.

2. Jurisdictional Deadline:

Absent an extension, Petitioner's Petition for a Writ of Certiorari is currently due on August 25, 2025, pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 13.1 (90 days from the date of entry of judgment).

3. Relief Requested:

Petitioner respectfully requests a 60-day extension of time, making the new due date October 24, 2025.

4. Grounds for Extension:

Petitioner is an [indigent] incarcerated individual currently confined at Federal Prison Camp Butner, in Butner, North Carolina 27509. Petitioner suffers from a rare and severely debilitating neurological condition known as Tolosa-Hunt Syndrome. This syndrome causes painful, recurrent inflammation of the cavernous sinus, often resulting in intense retro-orbital pain, ophthalmoplegia, and cranial nerve palsies, which significantly impairs Petitioner's vision, cognitive function, and ability to concentrate until fully abated.

Petitioner is presently undergoing an acute flare of this condition, rendering him medically incapacitated to perform and finalize the rigorous legal research, writing, and formatting necessary to timely prepare and file his Petition for Writ of Certiorari. Medical documentation is available upon request.

This is Petitioner's first (and foreseeably only) request for an extension of time. This request is made in good faith and not made for the purpose of delay. Petitioner seeks only the time necessary to recover sufficiently to finalize and submit the petition (which could easily be well under the 60-day request) in a meaningful and competent manner, and will submit his Writ of Certiorari shortly thereafter.

Respondent will not be prejudiced by the requested extension.

Petitioner respectfully asks the Court to consider his pro se status, limited access to legal resources while incarcerated, and severe, cronic medical condition in granting this request.
