ORDER

Jeremiah Farmer has filed a notice of appeal from the dismissal of his successive collateral attack under 28 U.S.C. § 2255 and several informal briefs, which we construe as an application for a certificate of appealability. A district court had previously denied Farmer's first collateral attack. See No. 23-CV-151 (N.D. Ind. May 23, 2024). Farmer does not contend that the district court abused its discretion in construing his post-judgment motions as unauthorized and successive collateral attacks in substance. And Farmer does not identify new and decisive proof of innocence that could not have been discovered previously through due diligence or a new constitutional rule made retroactive by the Supreme Court. See 28 U.S.C. § 2244(b)(2).

Accordingly, the request for a certificate of appealability is **DENIED**.
