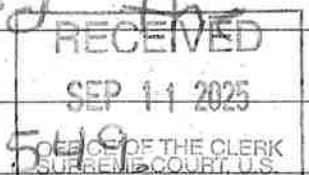

## ORDER

Jeremiah Farmer has filed a notice of appeal from the denial of his motion for appointment of counsel and an informal brief, which we construe as an application for a certificate of appealability. A district court had previously denied Farmer's first collateral attack. *See* No. 23-CV-151 (N.D. Ind. May 23, 2024). Farmer does not contend that the district court abused its discretion in construing his motion as an unauthorized and successive collateral attack in substance. And Farmer does not identify new and decisive proof of innocence that could not have been discovered previously through due diligence or a new constitutional rule made retroactive by the Supreme Court. *See* 28 U.S.C. § 2244(b)(2).

Accordingly, the request for a certificate of appealability is **DENIED**.
