

Application for an Extension of Time to File Petition for a Writ of Certiorari

To the Honorable Justice Elena Kagan, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States and Circuit Justice for the Ninth Circuit:

Dennis Michael Hogan a party in the above-captioned case, respectfully requests a 45-day extension of time, up to and including November 7th 2025, to file a petition for a writ of certiorari to review the judgment of the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit.

Judgment to be reviewed:

The judgment of the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit was entered on June, 24th 2025. (CASE No. 24-7537, D.C. No. 2:18-cr-00058-TOR-1, Eastern District of Washington, Spokane). The time for filing a petition for a writ of certiorari expires on September 24th. 2025. A copy of the court of appeals' opinion is attached as Exhibit A.

The jurisdiction of this Court is invoked under 28 U.S.C. § 1254(1).

Reason for the extension:

An extension of time is necessary for the following reasons:

- I am currently incarcerated at FCI La Tuna, and do not have adequate access to the library, making my time to work on this limited as well as mail takes a while to get in here.
- The complexity of the case requires additional time for me to review and prepare to submit the proper information for my case.

WHEREFORE, Dennis Michael Hogan, respectfully requests that the time for filing a petition for a writ of certiorari be extended up to and including November 7th 2025.

Before: CANBY, S.R. THOMAS, and SUNG, Circuit Judges.

The motion (Docket Entry No. 15) for summary affirmance of the district court's order denying appellant's second motion for a sentence reduction under 18 U.S.C. § 3582(c)(1)(A) is granted. *See United States v. Hooton*, 693 F.2d 857, 858 (9th Cir. 1982) (stating standard). Even assuming appellant exhausted his administrative remedies, he has not shown any abuse of discretion in the court's conclusions that he lacked extraordinary and compelling circumstances and that the 18 U.S.C. § 3553(a) factors did not support relief. *See United States v. Wright*, 46 F.4th 938, 944-45 (9th Cir. 2022). Moreover, notwithstanding a misstatement in the court's order, the record reflects that the court fully considered his arguments and adequately explained why they did not support relief. *See id.* at 948-50.
