MOTION FOR LEAVE TO PROCEED *IN FORMA PAUPERIS*

COMES NOW the Petitioner, Gabriel Brown, and, pursuant to Sup. Ct. Rule 39 moves for leave to proceed *in forma pauperis*.

1) United States District Court Magistrate Judge Charles H. Weigle determined Mr. Brown was indigent on February 10, 2023, and appointed the Federal Defenders of the Middle District of Georgia, Inc., to represent Mr. Brown under the provisions of 18 U.S.C. § 3006A. The Federal Defenders of the Middle District Georgia, Inc., also represented Mr. Brown before the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit.

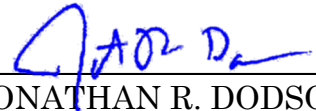
2) Mr. Brown remains indigent and wishes to pursue a writ of *certiorari* from this Court to the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit, which affirmed, in an unpublished opinion, Mr. Brown judgment on August 7, 2025.

3) As the District Court for the Middle District of Georgia and the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit appointed counsel for Mr. Brown, an indigent party, no affidavit or declaration by Mr. Brown is required pursuant to Sup. Ct. Rule 39(1).

WHEREFORE, Mr. Brown, through undersigned counsel, request that this Honorable Court allow him to proceed *in forma pauperis* and that the Office of the Federal Defenders of the Middle District of Georgia, Inc., continue to represent him.
