RE: Request for extension of time to file certiorari

Dear Clerk:

I was acquitted in my first trial of my top charge in Nassau County, New York. However, the prosecutors, in my retrial took me to trial on charges for which I was acquitted of. This was an obvious violation of the Constitution and my rights against Double Jeopardy. The problem I face now, however, is I do not speak English and I am having trouble prosecuting my appeal of my conviction(s). As it stands, there are very limited services available in the law library for even the English speakers---let alone ESL people like me. I want to preserve my chance to pursue redress with the U.S. Supreme Court as indicated by my lawyers. I need an extension of time to file for certiorari before the bell tolls.

I have included the documents that I have in my possession which verify my claims and for the need for an extension. I ask that the Court view this liberally.
