
**APPLICATION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME  
TO FILE PETITION FOR A WRIT OF CERTIORARI**

**To the Honorable Clerk of the Supreme Court of the United States:**

This application is submitted to the Clerk pursuant to Rule 13.5 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of the United States.

Pursuant to Rules 13.5 and 30 of the Rules of the Supreme Court, Petitioner Tasleema T. Yasin respectfully applies for an extension of time of 30 days to file a petition for a writ of certiorari in the above-captioned matter. The petition is presently due on February 17, 2026. Petitioner requests that the deadline be extended to and including March 19, 2026.

This Court has jurisdiction to review the judgment of the Supreme Court of Georgia pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1257(a). The judgment sought to be reviewed is the order of the Supreme Court of Georgia, entered September 16, 2025, denying Petitioner's application for discretionary appeal in Case No. S25C1160.



On January 31, 2026, this Court denied Petitioner's motion to proceed in forma pauperis and ordered that the petition be refiled in full compliance with Rule 33.1. Prior to that order, Petitioner's petition had been submitted on 8½- by 11-inch paper pursuant to Rule 33.2, the format available to in forma pauperis litigants. The denial of in forma pauperis status thus created, for the first time, the obligation to reformat the petition in Rule 33.1 booklet form — a format requiring specially sourced paper, precise typesetting, laser-quality printing, and the preparation of 40 bound copies — within a period of only 17 days.

Good cause exists for the requested extension. Rule 33.1 imposes exacting physical specifications: the petition must be printed on paper measuring exactly 6⅛ by 9¼ inches, in a Century family typeface at 12-point size, on opaque unglazed paper of not less than 60-pound weight, with ¾-inch margins on all sides, and bound in booklet or perfect-bound form. Paper of this dimension is not stocked by standard office supply retailers and must be specially ordered or custom-cut. Petitioner, proceeding pro se, has no prior experience preparing documents in this specialized format and no access to professional Supreme Court printing services.

The 17-day window between this Court's January 31 order and the February 17 deadline does not afford a pro se litigant a reasonable opportunity to accomplish these tasks. Petitioner must source the correctly sized paper, master the formatting requirements, typeset the petition, print it to laser-quality standards, and produce 40 compliant copies without professional assistance. The complexity of these mechanical requirements constitutes good cause for an extension under Rule 13.5.

This application is being filed at least 10 days before the current deadline as required by Rule 13.5.

Petitioner has already begun efforts to comply. She has identified the Rule 33.1 specifications, initiated the process of locating compliant paper stock, and commenced reformatting the petition. She intends to devote the full extension period to ensuring that the petition is submitted in strict compliance with this Court's Rules.

A 30-day extension will cause no prejudice to Respondent and will not materially affect the Court's calendar. The underlying petition raises substantial federal constitutional questions, including Due Process, Equal Protection, access to courts, and First Amendment retaliation claims arising from mandatory state e-filing system failures.

For the foregoing reasons, Petitioner respectfully requests that this Court extend the time to file her petition for a writ of certiorari to and including March 19, 2026.
