**PETITIONER'S APPLICATION TO EXTEND TIME
TO FILE PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI**

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To Whom It May Concern:

Pursuant to this Court's Rules 13.5, 22, 30.2, and 30.3, Petitioner Jordan L. Michelson respectfully requests that the time to file his Petition for Writ of Certiorari in this matter be extended for 90 days up to and including July 14, 2026. The Massachusetts Appeals Court issued its opinion on June 6, 2025, and denied motions for reconsideration on October 23, 2025, and November 5, 2025. The Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court denied a Petition for Further Appellate Review on January 15, 2026. Absent an extension of time, the Petition for Writ of Certiorari would be due on April 15, 2026. Petitioner is filing this Application more than ten days before that date. *See* S. Ct. R. 13.5. This Court would have jurisdiction over the judgment under 28 U.S.C. § 1257, in addition to the oversight powers implied under Articles III and VI of the U.S. Constitution.

REASONS FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

An extension of time is requested because the Petitioner is *pro se*, has limited bandwidth, lacks the specialized knowledge of Supreme Court rules and procedure, and will have to add substantial scaffolding to his briefs in order to explain why the state court's decision violated fundamental rights under the U.S. Constitution and why this matter is subject to the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court of the United States. Accordingly, Petitioner respectfully requests that the time to file his Petition for Writ of Certiorari be extended for 90 days. If granted, the Petition would be due on Tuesday, July 14, 2026.
