For the Fifth Circuit, Justice Alito, Presiding:

Pursuant to S. Ct. R. 13.5 and 22, Applicant J. M. D. (Applicant) respectfully requests that the time to file her petition for writ of certiorari in this matter be further extended to and include the 23rd day of March, 2026. S. Ct. R. 13.5 permits a Justice to extend the time to petition for writ of certiorari for a period not exceeding 60 days, upon demonstration of good cause.

Applicant previously applied to this Court for extension of time to petition for writ of certiorari on January 22, 2026. However, said application was not docketed until March 3, 2026. Justice Alito granted said petition on the same day, however, extending the time to a past date of February 5, 2026. Said extension granted in such timeline would be nugatory and creates good cause for additional extension of time for this Court to allow restitution to petition for writ of certiorari. The grant itself is greatly appreciated.<sup>1</sup> Applicant believes *bona fide* that this scenario is extremely rare and extraordinary.

Additional good causes are also present. The substance of the petition is prepared. The planned contents to be included in the voluminous appendices to the petition for writ of certiorari was not fully assembled and finalized until March 3, 2026. Additional time is needed to prepare these appendix documents and the petition itself, and reproduce them into the format and manner consistent and as required by S. Ct. R. 33.1.

Further good causes remains in part relevant and appears in the prior application for extension of time filed on January 22, 2026.

Wherefore, this Court should further extend the time to petition for writ of certiorari to and including March 23, 2026, to allow for sufficient time to reproduce the voluminous appendix documents and to provide restitution to the March 3, 2026 nugatory grant of the application, extending the time to the past date of February 5, 2026.
