


**APPLICATION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME
TO FILE PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI
TO THE SUPREME COURT OF TEXAS**

To the Honorable Samuel A. Alito, Jr.,
Associate Justice of the United States Supreme Court
and Circuit Justice for the Fifth Circuit:

Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 13.5, Petitioners respectfully request a 60-day extension of time, to and including **May 5, 2026**, within which to file a petition for a writ of certiorari to review the judgment of the Supreme Court of Texas in this case.

The Supreme Court of Texas denied review on September 5, 2025. Petitioners timely filed a motion for rehearing, which the Supreme Court of Texas denied on December 5, 2025. Under Supreme Court Rule 13.3, the time to file a petition for a writ of certiorari runs from the date of the denial of rehearing. The petition is therefore currently due on **March 5, 2026**.



This application is timely because it is being filed at least ten days before the petition is due. This is Petitioners' first request for an extension of time.

GOOD CAUSE

Petitioners are proceeding pro se and require additional time to finalize the petition, compile and organize the state court record, prepare the required appendix, and ensure full compliance with this Court's Rules.

The petition presents significant constitutional questions concerning procedural due process and state-created disciplinary procedures, requiring careful review of the record and relevant authorities. Preparation of the petition also requires assembling and reproducing numerous state court materials, disciplinary records, and related exhibits for inclusion in a properly formatted appendix.

Because of the complexity of the issues presented and the substantial record involved, additional time is necessary to prepare a complete and accurate submission that complies with this Court's Rules. Granting this extension will not prejudice Respondents.

CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, Petitioners respectfully request that the time to file a petition for a writ of certiorari be extended to and including **May 5, 2026**.


