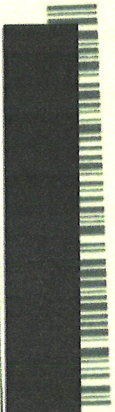

1. Under the provisions of AR 635-200, paragraphs 14-12b, and 14-12c, I am initiating separation for a pattern of misconduct and commission of a serious offense. The specific reasons for my proposed separation are:

a. AR 635-200, paragraph 14-12c, commission of a serious offense. On or about December 2021, [REDACTED] falsified a COVID-19 vaccination card asserting a vaccination date of 6 December 2021 and intentionally submitted said card as an official record.

b. AR 635-200, paragraph 14-12c, commission of a serious offense. On or about 23 February 2022, [REDACTED] disrespected a superior commissioned officer by writing "You suck" in the notebook belonging to Captain Sylburn Peterkin.

c. AR 635-200, paragraph 14-12b, a pattern of misconduct. On or about 30 April 2020 through 20 April 2022, [REDACTED] committed conduct prejudicial to good order and discipline including: entering senior rater comments in a NCOER without knowledge of nor permission by the senior rater, making inappropriate comments, losing military bearing, cursing, disrespecting others, and making derogatory statements about Soldiers.

2. I am recommending that you receive an other than honorable characterization of service. My recommendation and your reply will be submitted to the Commander, Army Reserve Medical Command, who is the separation authority and will make the final decision in your case. The intermediate commanders and the separation authority are not bound by my recommendation as to characterization of service. The separation authority may direct that your service be characterized as honorable, under honorable conditions, under other than honorable conditions, or you may receive an entry-level separation (uncharacterized) if you are in an entry-level status. However, the separation authority may not direct the issuance of a type of discharge or characterization of service less favorable than that recommended by the board should you request a hearing before an administrative board.

3. If my recommendation is approved, the proposed separation could result in discharge, release from active duty to a Reserve component, or release from custody and control of the Army.

5. You may obtain copies of documents that will be sent to the separation authority supporting the proposed separation. (Classified documents may be summarized).
6. You may request a hearing before an administrative board, or you may present written statements instead of requesting board proceedings.
7. You may request appointment of military counsel for representation. You may also retain civilian counsel at no expense to the Government.
8. You may waive the rights listed above in paragraph 4, 5, 6, and 7 in writing, and you may withdraw any such waiver at any time prior to the date the separation authority orders, directs, or approves your separation.
9. You may submit a conditional waiver of your right to have your case heard by an administrative separation board.
10. You are required to undergo a complete medical examination and a mental status evaluation in accordance with AR 40-501. Contact your unit to make arrangements for these examinations.
11. Execute the attached acknowledgment and return it within 7 duty days from the date of your receipt of this memorandum. Any statement you desire to submit in your behalf must reach me within 7 duty days after you receive this letter, unless you request and receive an extension for good cause shown. Unless an extension is granted, failure to respond within 7 duty days will constitute a waiver of the rights in paragraph 4, 5, 6, and 7.





The Respondent's Counsel had no challenges for cause against the Members of the Board.

The Members of the Board were sworn.

The Legal Advisor and Recorders were sworn.

The Recorder requested the document previously marked as Government Exhibit 5, consisting of 1 page, be submitted into evidence as Government Exhibit 5.

There being no sustainable objection from the Respondent's Counsel, the President of the Board accepted the document previously marked as

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Government Exhibit 5, consisting of 1 page, and attached it to the record as Government Exhibit 5.

**MSG Joseph Chumount, U.S. Army, was called as a witness for the Recorder, was sworn, and testified telephonically in substance as follows:**

**DIRECT EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Recorder:**

I am currently a 1SG in a TPU status in CEMARSG and from 2016-2023 and I was the detachment NCO for the 7228.

As a standard practice being the S1 she was an authorized delegate for administrative corrections on NCOERs. A delegate would have the ability to change the text on a NCOER, usually done to correct typos and formatting errors.

During our time when the unit was mobilized it was brought to my attention [REDACTED] was populating data in NCOER's and in one incident written the senior rater comments from scratch. At that point I sent an email to remove delegation authority from [REDACTED] [REDACTED] To my knowledge she was not instructed to write those comments.

I would describe her work performance as not meeting the standard. Virtually every document I received from here needed corrections, headers were wrong on documents, typos, formatting errors, signature block issues, documents submitted in the wrong format.

She would commonly refer to me as pizza face, I did not encourage the use of this name to Soldiers in the unit. Her attempts where to use it as a joking manner, but in most circumstances, I found it unprofessional. This was relatively frequent for a period of time, and it was done in the presence of other Soldiers. At one point I did tell her when others where present to not use that name and she did not stop after this talk.

I have witnessed her being rude to NCOs and Officers. I do remember instances where someone would ask her to do something, and she would refuse and this would be toward staff level NCOs and junior officers.

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She would often curse as a normal part of her conversation. She would use the word "fuck" often and this would be during duty hours while performing her job. I would say she said this daily as part of her normal conversation.

I had heard her yell and raise her voice but I cannot recall a specific date or incident. It would usually be at military personnel in the unit. I would consider this a loss of military bearing and a lack of professionalism.

Her actions degraded the trust in our AGR and administrative team. There was a point when admin tasks were routed to other soldiers to avoid the errors typical with [REDACTED].

I believe [REDACTED] failed to uphold the NCO creed because officers would have to constantly review her work which prevented them from completing their own tasks. I do not feel like she was technically proficient in her MOS. I do not feel like she upheld the "competency" is my watchword" section of the NCO creed.

Yes, those were accurate and true statements I made to the IO during the 15-6 investigation.

**CROSS-EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Respondent's Counsel:**

Definitively I cannot say it was [REDACTED] who made the changes but by process of elimination I can say it was her.

I did not directly counsel her on her deficiencies. Since she was AGR I allowed the senior AGRS to take care of the junior AGRS. I spoke to her but did not counsel her directly, I know SSG Davenport did counsel her as I saw that documentation.

MAJ Miller was a mentor to [REDACTED] and her work performance was noticeably better. I did notice that her work product dropped when MAJ Miller left the unit.

I do not recall anyone else in the unit calling me "pizza face". Yes "fuck" was used conversationally and this word has been used by other Soldiers in the office but not as liberally as [REDACTED].

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In my opinion she did not live up to the NCO creed, the NCO creed is a summary of our professional values as NCOs. I would say not every NCO lives up to the creed everyday of their lives.

**RE-DIRECT EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Recorder:**

Due to the timeframe from them and now I can't go on record to the specifics of the counseling SSG Davenport gave [REDACTED]. I believe some of it involved the misconduct talked about today.

It is not common for an NCO to not live up to all three paragraphs of the NCO creed.

**RE-CROSS-EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Respondent's Counsel:**

Its not unheard of for an NCO to not live up to all three paragraphs of the NCO creed.

**EXAMINATION BY THE BOARD**

**Questions by CPT Dockery:**

That was conversational and Infront of both superiors and subordinates.

When we were mobilized to fort hood it was understood all admin actions would be handled by the mobilized S1 since no one trusted [REDACTED] to work them properly.

**Questions by COL Murillo:**

The first time I heard "pizza face" was directly from SGT [REDACTED] and I did not correct her on the spot. It did start extending into public settings and that's when I spoke to her about it.

[The witness was duly warned and temporarily excused.]

**MAJ Jaime Landsverk, U.S. Army, was called as a witness for the Recorder, was sworn, and testified telephonically in substance as follows:**

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**DIRECT EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Recorder:**

I was in the 7228 around 2015-2021 as a detachment Commander and I was TPU Soldier. During this period I did interact with SGT [REDACTED]. The AGR staff was MAJ Miller, SSG Davenport and SGT [REDACTED]. SSG Davenport was soon transferred and MAJ Miller as well. SSG Draper came on board later on around the time when CPT Perkin arrived.

Yes there was a period where there was no full time officer.

There was a lot of in fighting and finger pointing, it got so bad I requested a week off from my job to try and pull the unit together. I wanted to be at the unit to onboard CPT Peterkin. I thought I solved the issued between SSG Draper and [REDACTED] with my approach to have everyone step back and to take a look at the root of the issues. The four of us sat in a conference room and I asked everyone to speak so that everyone could be heard. When they would speak to me one on one they would degrade each other and when we were in the room together it was a very different tone. I laid out the rules and responsibilities of everyone.

MAJ Miller called me to tell me about the issues he was having with [REDACTED] not doing work.

[REDACTED] and SSG Draper would constantly cross into each other's lane of responsibility's and would argue about who's doing what wrong. As soon as CPT Peterkin hit the ground, they would constantly go to him about petty issues.

I was not there when she moved offices, but that is when I heard she called me a "bitch" multiple times and that [REDACTED] was irate about moving. She was very vocal in the halls about calling me that. On a regular basis she was disrespectful to CPT Peterkin and even called him an asshole when he stood his ground to her, she said this directly to me about CPT Peterkin.

I have zero tolerance for disrespect and even went to IG and the commander for support with actions to take on [REDACTED]. I would stop and correct her when I overheard her being disrespectful. She would recognize this and would always look to place blame on others. She was putting in comments and signing off on NCOERs and I immediately took her off as a delegate.

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CPT Brooks was the OIC for the clinic in Texas and reached out from Texas when she found out [REDACTED] edited a NCOER. I would describe CPT Brooks as soft spoken and kind. I did not recognize her voice when she called me furious.

I took actions to remove her as a delegate on NCOER, changing comments was not part of [REDACTED] duties. When I spoke to her about it, she said "I was just trying to help out" but the NCOER was not overdue, and it felt like she downgraded that Soldier because she did not like them. Yes, this was the same NCOER CPT Brooks called me about.

Yes, but I never spoke to her alone. Her demeanor was disrespectful when I tried to speak to her, she would turn away, roll her eyes and this happened more than once. At a minimum it happened 5-10 times.

Yes, I received the COVID vaccine card. She was very vocal about being against the COVID vaccine, but not to me directly. She would say this around the office, and I heard it directly when I had to meet with the Soldiers who had not been vaccinated yet.

CPT Peterkin said the LOT number expired, I reached out to SGT [REDACTED] and asked where did she get the vaccine from. I then reached out to the facility to double check the expired LOT and the store said they never saw SGT [REDACTED] and they had no record of the LOT number.

At no point did I ever raise my voice with my staff. She did not yell directly at me just behind my back. The times SGT [REDACTED] would push back at me I would not engage. Our battalion Commander had scheduled for their S1 to come down to re-train SGT [REDACTED] and she called them and canceled the training. I do not recall if they came down and she was not there or if she reached out and canceled it.

I would describe her work performance as poor at best. During my tenure as Commander SGT [REDACTED] did everything in her power to not come into work. Her quality of work continued to worsen.

In my time as commander, she stirred a lot of drama and created a lot of animosity, mostly from the junior enlisted. she was removing files from officer ORBs that prevented them from being promoted.

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Prior to coming on as the commander my relationship with SGT [REDACTED] was very positive and pleasant.

I have not received any reprimand from any of my superiors stemming from my interactions with SGT [REDACTED], I was actually given a coin by the brigade commander when I was exiting the unit.

**CROSS-EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Respondent's Counsel:**

Yes I called the pharmacy in CA after SGT [REDACTED] confirmed the address where she received the vaccine that was the date I called them. I believe since she was out of town, she sent that info through email or text. We had a counseling session since she was requesting an exemption and that's when she stated her concerns about the vaccine. We received the vaccine card after this.

She told me she wanted to go back to college and she wasn't sure if she wanted to REFRAD, she then told me she wanted to stay in.

it would not surprise me to hear she went back to get once she learned she was caught to get her vaccine.

She asked for extended leave because her aunt passed away and I did approve that regardless of the vaccine status.

To an extent yes my career was impacted by SGT [REDACTED]. My reason for not being promoted was because I did not go to the Captains Career Course. I never have and never will hold SGT [REDACTED] accountable for me not being promoted, but she did make multiple errors in my ORB.

I did not try to have SGT [REDACTED] blamed for CPT Walker's ORB errors. I deferred to CPT Peterkin for help with this and did not put blame on SGT [REDACTED]. I don't think CPT Walker's situation would have been corrected either way, I was trying to get her a waiver for Captain Career Course.

I don't believe I yelled at SSG Draper in front of SFC Lawson. I recall counseling SSG Draper but not yelling.

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**EXAMINATION BY BOARD**

**Questions by CPT Guerin:**

This was the first instance that was brought to light about the editing of a NCOER. The guidance I received from the Chain of Command was to remove SGT [REDACTED] and any authority she had.

It escalated when documentation started to occur. She became very defensive and would send emails out attacking.

**Questions by CPT Dockery:**

If I communicated something to SGT [REDACTED] she did not want to hear she would roll her eyes and her demeanor would be disrespectful.

She cussed a lot to me but not at me. I talked about her language a lot to her.

[The witness was duly warned and temporarily excused.]

[The board recessed at 1127, 4 April 2024.]

[The board reconvened at 1139, 4 April 2024.]

**COL Rodger Jackson, U.S. Army, was called as a witness for the Recorder, was sworn, and testified telephonically in substance as follows:**

**DIRECT EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Recorder:**

I am the current brigade commander for CEMARSG. COL Luedeman was my predecessor.

My biggest concern as a medical professional was the trust given to these positions. So much of what we do requires trust for each other, especially those in our documentation.

Why would anyone think that writing "you suck" was ok in any circumstance.

Now we have a pattern that speaks to SGT [REDACTED]'s overall professionalism.

Respondents Counsel Objects, Rule 403.

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Board President Overruled.

I supported this case going forward to a separation board. I have faith in this process and that is why I recommended it to a board.

**CROSS-EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Respondent's Counsel:**

May of 2023, I arrived as the CEMARSG Commander. I was not the commander when this incident occurred, and I have not met SGT [REDACTED] personally.

A commander is responsible for the conditions and environment of a unit. Whether a mission succeeds or fails ultimately falls on the commanders shoulders. There is also a great degree of individual responsibility.

I am not local to the 7228. I receive reports from the downtrace leadership. The brigade commander is the senior rater of the 7228 commander.

[The witness was duly warned and temporarily excused.]

**CPT Slyburn Peterkin, U.S. Army, was called as a witness for the Recorder, was sworn, and testified telephonically in substance as follows:**

**DIRECT EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Recorder:**

I joined the 7228 on July 2021 and I was the health service administrator. I became XO when I arrived at the 7228. The fulltime staff was SGT [REDACTED], SPC Hyde, and SSG Draper.

Yes, she was instructed to swap offices by CPT Landsverk, SGT [REDACTED] was irate at this. While moving she went on a continuous rant about how unfair it was. She stated CPT Landsverk was a "bitch" and a "dictator" loud enough that others could hear.

SGT [REDACTED] was not a fan of the covid vaccine for numerous reasons. She sent an image of the vaccine card, and I had a lot of concerns with it. She was so against the vaccine that it shocked all

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of us when she did receive it. The vaccine card just didn't seem right. The LOT number was expired per the store's website. I confirmed by calling the store and confirming the LOT number. They confirmed that they had no record of this vaccination in their system.

In my notebook it said "you suck" with a smiley face, I then asked the group in a morning meeting who had done this, and SGT [REDACTED] said she did. She did state that she did this as a joke. My relationship was never a joking manner with SGT [REDACTED]. I took that note as disrespect when I saw it. SGT [REDACTED] is very strong minded and if she doesn't like someone you'll know it.

For a bit of time, she had animosity towards SSG Draper and she would try to protect the lower enlisted, which I am fine with, but it felt like her against everyone. If felt like powerplays for her to regain control of her section.

SGT [REDACTED] demeanor towards me was disrespectful frequently. After a while I had to put pen to paper. she would yell at me and talk with her hands; I took this as being disrespectful. I have never raised my voice to SGT [REDACTED].

When she would yell at me there was usually other soldiers in the area.

SGT [REDACTED] actions undermined the operations of the 7228, I tried to help on multiple occasions, and she was not susceptible to it. Her performance was substandard during that time frame.

The statements I made in the 15-6 was true. I did not receive any negative repercussions from my interaction with SGT [REDACTED]

**CROSS-EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Respondent's Counsel:**

Yes, I took MAJ Millers position, he was SGT [REDACTED] supervisor. I was not aware of a MSM for SGT [REDACTED] from MAJ Miller.

Yes she did receive a GOMOR. From what I remember she was not allowed to access some systems. I was in the S3 shop during that time and was never moved to the S1 shop.

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**EXAMINATION BY BOARD**

**Questions by CPT Dockery:**

Because she was so adamant, I guessed the covid card was fraudulent. She would speak about how oppressive the vaccine was and how they were taking away people's freedom. Her to get the vaccine out of nowhere was shocking, we did check up on other individuals. I would say we checked up on two other individuals.

Legal Advisor stops the interview and advises the board that the line of questioning might infringe on the witness's 5<sup>th</sup> amendment rights of self-incrimination.

SSG Shultz was appointed to that position to take care of S1 duties and she was TPU during that time. She worked in the RPAC and she was allowed to do the duties of the 7228.

Yes, there were cuss words used and she use them about other people.

**RE-CROSS-EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Respondent's Counsel:**

The pharmacy sent a fax to me, I know they sent one to me for sure, I do not recall sending a fax to them. I talked to CPT Landsverk before I called the pharmacy.

[The witness was duly warned and temporarily excused.]

[The board recessed at 1234, 4 April 2024.]

[The board reconvened at 1409, 4 April 2024.]

The Respondents Counsel challenges for cause against the legal advisor, for lack of impartiality and bias.

[The board recessed at 1412, 4 April 2024.]

[The board reconvened at 1432, 4 April 2024.]

The Board President denies the challenge for cause against the legal advisor.

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[The board recessed at 1439, 4 April 2024.]

[The board reconvened at 1444, 4 April 2024.]

**COL James D. Ferguson, U.S. Army, was called as a witness for the Recorder, was sworn, and testified telephonically in substance as follows:**

**DIRECT EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Recorder:**

I am the commander of the 7228 MSU and I did sign the notice of separation for SGT [REDACTED].

I think SGT [REDACTED] should not be retained in the Army Reserves. Should would not have my trust to continue her duties in accordance with the NCO creed.

Respondents Counsel objects, rule 403.

The Board President overrules.

I would recommend an Other Than Honorable characterization of service.

When I first took command SGT [REDACTED] was consistent with professionalism, but in the last five months my opinion has changed.

**CROSS-EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Respondent's Counsel:**

None.

**EXAMINATION BY BOARD**

**Questions by CPT Guerin:**

My opinion has only been changed in the last five months.

[The witness was duly warned and temporarily excused.]

[The board recessed at 1455, 4 April 2024.]

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[The board reconvened at 1505, 4 April 2024.]

**LTC Christopher Sporleder, U.S. Army, was called as a witness for the Recorder, was sworn, and testified telephonically in substance as follows:**

**DIRECT EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Recorder:**

I am the current XO for the 7228 MSU and I have been here for eight and a half years.

I've had no difficulties interacting with SGT [REDACTED]. SGT [REDACTED] can be a very eager and can do Solider. When I came back from deployment the change in attitude was dramatically different. The unit was no longer as productive as it used to be in providing services. I have not seen SGT [REDACTED] in the last six months or so.

SGT [REDACTED] has been and has demonstrated herself to be efficient and self-sufficient and I never had a problem with her following directions. I find all this out of character compared to what I've seen in the previous six plus years.

**CROSS-EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Respondent's Counsel:**

I was gone on a deployment when CPT Landsverk arrived, I can only surmise that something produced a change in SGT [REDACTED]

I've known SGT [REDACTED] for about six years.

**EXAMINATION BY BOARD**

**Questions by CPT Dockery:**

The tasks I would give her was data entry and dashboard information generally.

[The witness was duly warned and temporarily excused.]

[The Government Rested.]

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Defense requested that exhibits A-E be submitted into evidence as defense exhibits A-E.

There being no sustainable objection from the Recorder, the President of the Board accepted the documents previously marked as Defense Exhibits A into evidence as Defense Exhibits A-D.

[defense exhibits admitted.]

**CPT Jaime Walker, U.S. Army, was called as a witness for the Respondent, was sworn, and testified telephonically in substance as follows:**

**DIRECT EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Respondent's Counsel:**

I work at Jeffersons medical group. I served with SGT [REDACTED] in the Army Reserve and she served as our S1. I met her in 2018. I have only been to one duty station. She went above and beyond and made sure we had guidance. She was unbiased in who she helped, I would see a line outside her office on many occasions.

When I was there, CPT Peterkin was friendly with me but would snub SSG Draper and SGT [REDACTED]. It was uncomfortable and I was there for only two weeks witnessing this. CPT Peterkin was a full time AGR superior during that time. I just know that he was really rude to everyone but myself during that time.

I think SGT [REDACTED] is a good NCO, she was dependable, competent, made sure all the Soldiers had what they needed. She was available outside of work hours and was very compassionate. Outside of drill weekends or duty hours she would always answer her phone.

I'd heard CPT Landsverk make smart remarks about other Soldiers.

SGT [REDACTED] is a good NCO who made sure all her Soldiers had everything done.

I would support an Honorable characterization of service. I never seen her be disrespectful. She was the only one in the unit who reached out to me during hard times. She showed me the ropes and would do that for other Soldiers as well.

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**CROSS-EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Recorder:**

I was there during April of 2022 for AT.

He made snide remarks at his door, he would close her door in a forceful manner, and it was very tense and uncomfortable. It was more rude than anything. I did not report this as he was moving out of the unit.

I think a lot of counseling's were done and I was put in a position I did not want to be in, I never saw SGT [REDACTED] be disrespectful.

I was not aware SGT [REDACTED] called CPT Landsverk a "bitch". I would not lose all respect for SGT [REDACTED] if this was true, I just do not see her saying something like that. I've always saw her as a great Solider.

**EXAMINATION BY BOARD**

**Questions by the CPT Guerin:**

Yes I saw her interact with MAJ Miller, those interactions seemed fine.

I do not think it had to do with specific people in her Chain of Command. She had a good relationship with MAJ Miller who was in her Chain of Command.

[The witness was duly warned and permanently excused.]

**Kevin Lawson, Civilian, was called as a witness for the Respondent, was sworn, and testified telephonically in substance as follows:**

**DIRECT EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Respondent's Counsel:**

I work for the city of white hall, Ohio. I retired from the Army Reserve in September 2022. I met SGT [REDACTED] sometime in 2018.

I think SGT [REDACTED] has an outstanding character, for her unit and others she seemed like the go-to person for anything that was

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going on. She would offer assistance all the time. She is strong, capable and dependent. Her work ethic is second to none, I could call her at anytime during the day and she would offer her support.

I was asked to sit in on a counseling session regarding SGT [REDACTED]. I think things went all right, but then there was a comment made by the counselor that I thought was unprofessional for a counseling session. The comment was about buying flowers for secretary's day or something like that and I thought that was an unprofessional remark by CPT Landsverk.

I've never seen SGT [REDACTED] talk badly to anyone while I was around. I don't think her interpersonal tact was off putting. SGT [REDACTED] upheld the NCO creed. It would be outside her character to call someone outside their name.

I would be honored to share a fox hole with this Soldier, and I would hope that she be retained and allowed to continue her career.

**CROSS-EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Recorder:**

No, I was not a member of the 7228 MSU. I didn't have her job description and I advised her as a career counselor.

I was not in her chain of command or rating scheme.

I know at the time I felt it was an inappropriate comment to make during a counseling session.

As far as I know she has lived up to the NCO creed. The time that I was with her and the interactions I had on family days, I have never seen or heard her say anything like that. I did interact with her on a day to day basis. The staff was very limited to begin with.

I was not aware of the misconduct SGT [REDACTED] is being accused of. I can only tell you what I know and my own interactions with SGT [REDACTED]. She helped me a lot and my interactions were not limited with her.

**RE-DIRECT EXAMINATION**

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**Questions by the Respondent's Counsel:**

I am aware that these are allegations.

**EXAMINATION BY THE BOARD**

**Questions by CPT Dockery:**

No I do not know of anyone else that I could have gone to, to get help. It wasn't just me it was other Soldiers who would go to her for questions and guidance.

**Questions by CPT Guerin:**

I was the very first office when you came into the building, about 50-75 feet away from the 7228 offices. Yes, I would over hear them talking when I was near them but not when I was in my office. I was in there office area a decent amount.

I do not recall her ever yelling at anyone in the 7228 offices. I know there was a lot of closed door stuff, I thought in the beginning they were cohesive but them overtime it seemed like when individuals changed out they became less cohesive.

**Questions by COL Murillo:**

I do not recall her using unprofessional language to me.

[The witness was duly warned and permanently excused.]

**SSG Morales Rivera, U.S. Army, was called as a witness for the Respondent, was sworn, and testified telephonically in substance as follows:**

**DIRECT EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Respondent's Counsel:**

I am with the 7226 MSU as the training NCO. I have nine years total service. I met SGT [REDACTED] in 2017 and had worked with her for about a year in the 304 Civil Affairs Brigade. She was the S1 for the Brigade.

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When I first arrived, she was my sponsor, and she held my hand for the whole process. She explained everything to me and explained the in-processing of an AGR Soldier to me.

I first stayed in a hotel when I arrived, then stayed with a marine until I was finically stable.

When I first came onto AGR HRC cut my orders wrong and I incurred a debt. When they fixed my pay, they recouped all the money. SGT [REDACTED] was the one NCO that was able to provide me guidance on how to recoup the money that was taken from me.

She will always advocate and speak up if there was something wrong in the unit. She would come off very passionate, she is a passionate first line leader.

I would see SGT [REDACTED] regularly stay behind after hours to continue working while at the 304th, she does live up to the NCO creed.

I am aware of the allegations against SGT [REDACTED] and I am still willing to speak to her character. Of the team of three at brigade level she would always stay behind to work. She would always advocate for Soldiers who needed help.

If given the proper mentorship she would be a great NCO.

**CROSS-EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Recorder:**

I did not work with SGT [REDACTED] after 2018, only while she was at the 304th.

**EXAMINATION BY THE BOARD**

**Questions by CPT Guerin:**

I was the HHC Training NCO. Her Chain of Command and mines where different, she reported to the CSM and COL.

I believe you should act accordingly once you get your stripes as a NCO.

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**Questions by CPT Dockery:**

CPT Turner let me know about the alleged misconduct against SGT [REDACTED].

**Questions by COL Murillo:**

I was in contact with SGT [REDACTED] from 2020-2021, I was deployed from 2020-2021 and I did not have a conversation about the vaccine with her.

[The witness was duly warned and permanently excused.]

**SGT Deija Hyde, U.S. Army, was called as a witness for the Respondent, was sworn, and testified telephonically in substance as follows:**

**DIRECT EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Respondent's Counsel:**

I am currently station in Vancouver, WA since 2023 and I have 15 years of service. I am a 68J medical supply specialist.

I met SGT [REDACTED] in 2020 and I worked with her for three years. She is a fantastic friend and mentor and is very headstrong and resilient. She is a hard worker and would come in early and work late almost every day while I was there.

She is trustworthy. I do not believe that the allegation she submitted a false COVID-19 card is true. It is disheartening that she is being accused of that because she is a truthful person, and she would not falsify any type of documentation. I was not aware that CPT Peterkin emailed or faxed the pharmacy and it would surprise me if they did not have a record of SGT [REDACTED] being there.

I do not have a lot of positive things to say about CPT Landsverk, it was a very toxic and manipulative environment. She treat the AGR staff poorly and all of our day to day tasks had to be documented and our meetings felt very one sided. My opinion on CPT Peterkin was he was driven by his work and through CPT Landsverk, he would execute everything she wanted and could not form his own opinion.

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I was treated poorly, one day CPT Peterkin was friendly and the next day she was a different way. She seemed more friendly towards TPU Soldiers then AGR Soldiers. They did not appreciate SGT [REDACTED] perspective and would shoot her opinion down. This hurt SGT [REDACTED] but she kept pushing and working.

The office culture between NCOs was great for a year and a half then a new training NCO came in and that was manageable, there was more good days then bad days.

CPT Landsverk arrived first then SSG Draper arrived. CPT Landsverk interactions with the NCOs made the environment worse. She would yell at all three of us and that made me feel uncomfortable and like I did not matter.

SGT [REDACTED] put in countless work hours and dedication into the unit, at one point it was her doing everything for the unit for six months to a year. I would support an Honorable characterization of discharge because she deserves it.

**CROSS-EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Recorder:**

I did not supervise SGT [REDACTED]e. I still find the allegation disheartening despite Sams Club saying they did not have record of SGT [REDACTED]. I believe it was a miscommunication that should have been investigated further, It's still disheartening because I feel like SGT [REDACTED] did not falsify her vaccine card.

Respondents Counsel Objects, asked and answered.

Board President overruled.

It does not change my opinion at all that Sams Club came back and said they had no record.

I'm aware that leaders have different leadership styles and I believe CPT Landsverk chose the wrong style.

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**EXAMINATION BY THE BOARD**

**Questions by CPT Guerin:**

As a whole SSG Draper and her worked together fine, when you have new personal come in you have to understand how they operate especially when you work close together, there was some spats as far as how some things should go compared to how they were done in the past. I would say overall CPT Landsverk treated us differently. Of the three of us she seemed to have the most conflict with SGT [REDACTED]. I would say this happened sometime in 2021 and had something to do with her ORB, and I heard from other Soldiers that she blamed SGT [REDACTED] for ruining her career. After that she treated her differently.

CPT Peterkin treated SGT [REDACTED] a little differently because of CPT Landsverk.

SGT [REDACTED] did not use cuss words conversationally around me; she was very respectful to the full time staff and TPU Soldiers.

**Questions by COL Murillo:**

I don't know him a lot because he was mobilized most of that time. I never heard him be called "pizza face". Her office was about 10-15 feet away from mines.

SGT [REDACTED] was hesitate to get the COVID vaccine. I don't recall her verbalizing her discontent to me about the vaccine.

[The witness was duly warned and permanently excused.]

**Jesse Guerin, Civilian, was called as a witness for the Respondent, was sworn, and testified in substance as follows:**

**DIRECT EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Respondent's Counsel:**

I am retired from the Army Reserve and had over 18 years of service and I met SGT [REDACTED] around 2016 in Philadelphia and did not meet her in Missouri.

She was our S1 clerk with the 304 Civil Affairs Brigade. I worked with her for about a year or year and a half. She always did

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the right thing and as a S1 clerk she always went above and beyond to take care of Soldiers. She has the upmost integrity, and I never had any problems with her. She went out of her way to help me with a packet to separate a Soldier.

She was always a hard worker, there was a gap between the NCOIC leaving and the new NCOIC incoming where she would work late and take over. Even after the new NCOIC arrived SGT [REDACTED] stayed the backbone of the S1.

I would support SGT [REDACTED] being retained in the Army for her to REFRAD or to get a General (Under Honorable Conditions) discharge.

**CROSS-EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Recorder:**

I did not work with SGT [REDACTED] after 2018. Based off my professional experience with SGT [REDACTED] I feel like an Other Than Honorable would be extreme.

I'm not saying that was the right thing to do, but I also believe sometimes people don't think about the long-term effects and just what is best for them at that moment.

**RE-DIRECT EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Respondent's Counsel:**

I believe the latter paragraph applies to SGT [REDACTED], every case is delt with on a case by case basis.

**RE-CROSS-EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Recorder:**

I have not reviewed SGT [REDACTED]'s full record.

**EXAMINATION BY THE BOARD**

**Questions by CPT Guerin:**

I believe everything is case by case. During these circumstances I view COVID differently from a regular Flu vaccine.

[The witness was duly warned and permanently excused.]

[The board recessed at 1725, 4 April 2024]

[The board reconvened at 1732, 4 April 2024]

[The board recessed at 1733, 4 April 2024]

[The board reconvened at 0919, 5 April 2024]

All parties who were present when the board recessed were again present.

Defense requested that exhibits B be submitted into evidence as defense exhibits B.

There being no sustainable objection from the Recorder, the President of the Board accepted the documents previously marked as Defense Exhibits B into evidence as Defense Exhibits B.

[defense exhibits admitted.]

Defense requested that exhibits C be submitted into evidence as defense exhibits C.

There being no sustainable objection from the Recorder, the President of the Board accepted the documents previously marked as Defense Exhibits C into evidence as Defense Exhibits C.

[defense exhibits admitted.]

**SGT [REDACTED], respondent, made the following unsworn statement in substance as follows:**

I want to first start by apologizing to the board members. Prior to me asking to stop the side bars I thought there was a rush for time, I had been walking out each other time before that.

This has been really hard to stay here while everyone is out enjoying their day.

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My mentors and friends are now 11B, drill sergeants, and Army Rangers. I learned a lot from them, my mentors are leaders, they took the time to get to know me. They took the time to cultivate me. The same cannot be said about the leadership assigned to the 7228. I lost a major part of myself at some point during my current assignment. I see SGT Lopez's easiness to smile and I think to myself I was like that, I was told as an E1 to not lose that and somehow I did. My time here has killed the Solider I once was which makes me feel betrayed. I regret not able to maintain my military bearing for a multitude of reasons but the most important is perception, unfortunately I care too much. I am known as a triangulation, incompetent, prejudice among other unfavorable adjectives to describe myself in all of these findings and sworn statements. I am very disappointed in ARMEDCOM and the lack of process given to me in the last several years. it has been the cause for my accelerated decline in mental health the last several months. The effect of a delayed process doesn't just affect a Soldier's career but also their mental health. I didn't know it then, but I also suffered from postpartum depression. I was only checked on when my name came up on a overdue tracker when I was going through suicidal ideations. The only time I was rehabilitated is with LTC Sporleder and MAJ Miller. We all reached out to Battalion IG and received no assistance. I have been approached and publicly shamed by non-need to know personnel. This has added to my stress and anxiety. My school advisor asked me if I was ok and that spoke volumes as I have not been asked that often. With prayer, faith, and the support of my family I have started to communicate my behavioral health issues. I am deeply regretful for my actions, words, and any offense that was unintentionally given and I am currently attempting to recover. Only be the mercy and glory of god I hope to help rehabilitate other veterans through equine assistance services as well as the Mennonite community, while establishing roots for my children. I request that I ben retained so that I may be able to REFRAD and be separated.

**DIRECT EXAMINATION**

**Questions by the Respondent's Counsel:**

I did not receive the COVID vaccine on 6 December 2021. I did submit a vaccine card that said I received it on this date. My aunt had just died from COVID and my husband was telling me don't get it. While on leave I asked for an exemption and I was told I would not be able to get my leave extended unless I received the vaccine.

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I did get the vaccine on 11 December 2021. This process has taken around four years. I got the vaccination screen shot from the Sams Club app on my phone.

I did not give CPT Peterkin permission to call Sams Club, he was my supervisor not my Commander.

That was an award I received in 2020. That is an email or draft for an MSN for when I was set to PCS.

That is a doctor's notes with a diagnosis of major depression disorder and anxiety.

I've lost my respect for people in a position of authority, There's no honor to it.

I did write "you suck" in his notebook with a smiley face next to it and meant it jokingly, I've extended several olive branches.

The Respondent's Counsel rested.

The Recorder made closing arguments.

The Respondent's Counsel made closing arguments.

The Recorder provided rebuttal to the closing argument of the Respondent's Counsel.

The Legal Advisor read the deliberation instructions.

[The board closed at 1044, 5 April 2024, for deliberation.]

[The board reconvened at 1230, 4 April 2024.]

All parties present when the board closed were again present.

**FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS**

The President of the Board read, verbatim, the findings and recommendations (attached DA Form 1574). The Board determined the Respondent should be separated.

[The board adjourned at 1233, 4 April 2024.]

SUBJECT: Appeal of Administrative Separation Board for SGT [REDACTED] (5 April 2024)

1. References:

- a. U.S. Army Regulation (AR) 635-200.
- b. U.S. Army Regulation (AR) 15-6.

2. The purpose of this memorandum is to appeal the Board's Finding's and Separation decision in the above-mentioned Administrative Separation Board that occurred at AR-MEDCOM on 4-5 April 2024. For the reasons listed below and in SGT [REDACTED] enclosed letter, I respectfully request you consider the facts and circumstances herein and upgrade SGT [REDACTED]'s characterization to a General Under Honorable Conditions.

3. SGT [REDACTED] has over 11 years of service in the United States Army. An investigation began after she submitted a COVID-19 vaccination card. That card was shown by a preponderance of the evidence to be a fraudulent COVID-19 vaccination card. SGT [REDACTED]'s letter will emphasize other aspects of this investigation and board process, and their effect on her mental health and how she feels. See Enclosure 1. This memorandum will emphasize issues with the investigation and the procedures at SGT [REDACTED]'s administrative separation board.

4. The process began with a Captain Investigating Officer. SGT [REDACTED] provided a sworn statement to that Captain. That Captain recommended SGT [REDACTED] be reduced in rank, and never recommended a separation board for SGT [REDACTED] in their memorandum. See Enclosure 2. In 2022, SGT [REDACTED] received a GOMOR for the fraudulent COVID vaccine card, which was permanently filed. See Enclosure 3.

5. The next part of this process was the preparation for the Administrative Separation Board. The key issues relate to due process and the fundamental fairness to a Respondent facing an Enlisted Administrative Separation Board.

a. The Respondent, through Respondent's Counsel, received the final enclosures for this Administrative Separation Board via DoD SAFE on 3 April 2024, the day before the board. Enclosure 4. AR 15-6 requires notice to Respondent of enclosures no less than 10 days before the date of the board. See AR 15-6, para. 7-5. This is a violation of Respondent's due process.

b. The Respondent and Respondent's Counsel first found out who would be members of the Board on 4 April 2024 (i.e., when they arrived). AR 15-6 requires Recorder to notify Respondent no less than 10 days before the Board. See AR 15-6, para. 3-13 and para. 7-5. Respondent's Counsel specifically requested the names, ranks, and units of the Board Members via email on January 18, 2024. Enclosure 5. This is a violation of Respondent's due process. Without this information, Respondent cannot determine if they have met the Board members or if the Board members may have a bias against respondent.

6. Lastly, there were procedural and evidentiary errors raised by Respondent's counsel during the Administrative Separation Board from 4-5 April 2024.

a. **Respondent Objection to Legal Advisor.** Respondent's Counsel objected to the Legal Advisor on ground of bias and partiality immediately after the lunch period. The basis was the Legal Advisor showing bias against the Respondent's presentation of the case. The first instance was during Voir Dire when Respondent's Counsel asked a question that would show the Board member's partiality and bias. Respondent's counsel requested individual Voir Dire to protect the Board President from other Board members knowing her answers. "Discretion will be used, however, to avoid revealing prejudicial matters to other members of the board." See AR 15-6, para. 7-7b. If the question is related to a Board member's impartiality, then no part of the Board procedures protects a Board President from being asked personal questions during individual Voir Dire. The Legal Advisor, over-stepping and without a question or concern raised, instructed the Board President could decline to answer because it was personal, and the Board President followed the Legal Advisor's advice. This interruption was improper under AR 15-6, para. 2-6b. The Board did not raise a concern or question, the legal advisor interjected without request. See AR 15-6, para. 7-7d.

The second time Legal Advisor unnecessarily interjected himself in the process was during CPT Syllburn Peterkin's sworn testimony. CPT Peterkin was talking about his own reasons for not receiving the COVID-19 vaccination. A Board member asked about why he followed-up on (or investigated without authority) some COVID-19 vaccinations, but not others. The Legal Advisor interrupted CPT Peterkin's testimony and wanted to warn the Board members that we were getting close to self-incriminating testimony on the part of CPT Peterkin. The interruption was unwarranted, and prompted the Board Member to move on from her line of questioning. Later, the Legal Advisor said that

Board Members should be able to ask about whatever they wanted to ask about. These statements are in direct conflict. The Legal Advisor should always be a neutral and detached non-voting member of the Board. They should not interrupt unless the Board has questions or raises concerns. See AR 15-6, para 2-6b. In this situation, the Legal Advisor's interruption was akin to him taking on the role of representative of CPT Peterkin. It was inappropriate, and calls into question why he chose the timing to interrupt. The answer would have revealed a bias against SGT [REDACTED]. After the interruption, the Board member did not press on with the question, even though all agreed we had not arrived at a self-incriminating statement. This interruption prejudiced SGT [REDACTED]'s due process rights.

Immediately after CPT Peterkin's testimony, the lunch recess was taken. Before resuming with the next Recorder's witnesses testimony, Respondent's Counsel stated on the record a challenge to the Legal Advisor for bias and not being an impartial legal advisor based on the above two interruptions that heavily favored the Recorder's case. A recess was taken where the Recorder consulted with his Deputy Staff Judge Advocate. The Deputy looked up the regulations and provided the regulation related to challenges to the Board. The Deputy should not have participated in that way. The Board President heard the arguments from each party, then overruled the Respondent's Counsel's objection. That decision was incorrect, and the legal advisor should have been excused for cause.

**b. Commanders Improperly Requesting Discharge Characterizations.** During the testimony of two of Recorder's witnesses, SGT [REDACTED]'s Commanders were asked whether they recommended separation, and also what type of characterization they recommended. Respondent's Counsel objected based on AR 15-6, para. 3-7(d)(1), the incorporation of Military Rule of Evidence (M.R.E.) 403. SGT [REDACTED] current Commander stated Separation with an Other Than Honorable. Her former Commander stated Separation, but did not request a characterization. "Although relevant, evidence may be excluded if its probative value is substantially outweighed by the danger of unfair prejudice, confusion of the issues, or misleading the members . . ." among other listed factors. AR 15-6, para 3-7(d)(1). Even if the Commander's requested outcomes were relevant, they were inappropriate testimony. The Commander's requested characterizations encouraged the Board Members to recommend an Other than Honorable, resulting in unfair prejudice. The Commanders requests also mislead the members to think that the Commanders, who had no authority to approve an Other than Honorable, had authority to approve an Other than Honorable. Then in Recorder's closing he referenced their testimony again, and diminished Respondent's witnesses testimony of what outcome they support based on their knowledge of the allegations and SGT [REDACTED] career. Recorder's comments in his closing were inappropriate under M.R.E. 403. SGT [REDACTED] has due process rights as a respondent entitled to an administrative separation board, which include a fair proceeding with an impartial Board President and Legal Advisor. She was not given a fair proceeding.

7. Considering the issues noted above and the requirement that the Soldier's entire 11 year military service record be considered in determining characterization, the fair

answer for this Soldier is a General characterization of discharge. See AR 635-200, para. 3-7b. "[A] general (under honorable conditions) discharge may be furnished when disqualifying entries in the Soldier's military record are outweighed by prior or subsequent honest and faithful service over a greater period of time during the current term of service." "Due consideration will be given to the Soldier's age, length of service, grade, aptitude, physical and mental conditions, and the standards of acceptable conduct and performance of duty." AR 635-200, para. 3-5d. With a General characterization of discharge, SGT [REDACTED] may be entitled to Department of Veteran Affairs benefits that will help her get mental health assistance. AR 635-200, para. 3-5f and para. 3-6b. The unit still benefits because they get the Soldier out of their unit for the Soldier's misconduct. Please see that this Service Member is worth more than her worst days, and approve a General characterization so she can seek behavioral health after separation.

8. On 5 April 2024, I requested the audio recording of the board to prepare these matters. As of the date of this memorandum, I have not received the audio recording of the board.
