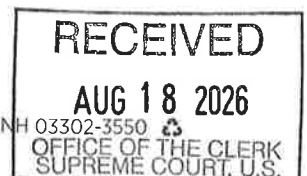
Dear Clerk Harris,

I am counsel for respondent Robert Arias. Pursuant to Rule 15.3, any brief in opposition to the petition for certiorari filed in this case is presently due by August 22, 2026, a Saturday. By operation of Rule 30.1, an opposition brief would be due Monday, August 24, 2026. Please consider this letter to be a motion pursuant to Rule 30.4 to extend the time to file an opposition brief by an additional thirty (30) days, up to and including Monday, September 24, 2026.

This is the first request for extension of time to file a brief in opposition. There is good cause for the extension. In particular, and in addition to the normal conflicts with our existing trial schedule, I and my co-counsel in this matter, James P. Bassett, are not yet members of the Bar of this Court. We are both in the process of preparing our Supreme Court of the United States bar admission applications. We expect to submit them shortly but are not certain when those applications will be approved. We are optimistic that this extension will permit us sufficient time to obtain admission to the bar of the Court and address our other trial commitments over the coming weeks. However, we are in communication with the office of the Solicitor in the event that a further extension may prove necessary. The office of the Solicitor General, Petitioner, has assented to this initial extension to the extent such assent is required at this stage.

In filing this extension request by letter, we acknowledge that the actual brief in opposition must be filed by a member of the Bar.

Respondent respectfully requests that the deadline for filing a brief in opposition to the petition for certiorari be extended by an additional thirty (30) days to September 24, 2026. In accordance



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with Rules 29 and 30.4, I have served a copy of this letter on counsel for the parties and have enclosed proof of service.
