**UNOPPOSED APPLICATION FOR SECOND
EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE BRIEF IN OPPOSITION**

This Court requested that Respondent the City of San Antonio (the “City”) file a brief in opposition to the petition for a writ of certiorari filed by Petitioners Gary Perez and Matilde Torres. The Court previously granted the City a 30-day extension of time to file the brief in opposition, which is currently due September 30, 2026. The City respectfully requests that the Court grant it a second unopposed 30-day extension of time to file the brief in opposition, up to and including October 30, 2026. This application is timely because it is filed more than ten days before the current due date.

There is good cause for a second extension of time. The City’s counsel of record was part of a team trying a three-week jury trial in Miami, Florida, that ended on August 31, 2026. The case is *Maricela Mata, et al. v. Expedia Group, Inc., et al.*, No. 1:19-cv-22529-Altonaga, in the United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida, Miami Division. The City’s counsel of record was unable to participate in preparing the

brief in opposition until after the trial. In addition, twelve amicus briefs have been filed in this action, including nine of them filed on August 31. The City seeks additional time to review the amicus filings and respond meaningfully to them as part of the brief in opposition.

Petitioners do not oppose this request for a second 30-day extension.
