As part of your supervised release, you must comply with the following standard conditions of supervision. These conditions are imposed because they establish the basic expectations for your behavior while on supervision and identify the minimum tools needed by probation officers to keep informed, report to the court about, and bring about improvements in your conduct and condition.

1. You must report to the probation office in the federal judicial district where you are authorized to reside within 72 hours of your release from imprisonment, unless the probation officer instructs you to report to a different probation office or within a different time frame.
2. After initially reporting to the probation office, you will receive instructions from the court or the probation officer about how and when you must report to the probation officer, and you must report to the probation officer as instructed.
3. You must not knowingly leave the federal judicial district where you are authorized to reside without first getting permission from the court or the probation officer.
4. You must answer truthfully the questions asked by your probation officer.
5. You must live at a place approved by the probation officer. If you plan to change where you live or anything about your living arrangements (such as the people you live with), you must notify the probation officer at least 10 days before the change. If notifying the probation officer in advance is not possible due to unanticipated circumstances, you must notify the probation officer within 72 hours of becoming aware of a change or expected change.
6. You must allow the probation officer to visit you at any time at your home or elsewhere, and you must permit the probation officer to take any items prohibited by the conditions of your supervision that he or she observes in plain view.
7. You must work full time (at least 30 hours per week) at a lawful type of employment, unless the probation officer excuses you from doing so. If you do not have full-time employment you must try to find full-time employment, unless the probation officer excuses you from doing so. If you plan to change where you work or anything about your work (such as your position or your job responsibilities), you must notify the probation officer at least 10 days before the change. If notifying the probation officer at least 10 days in advance is not possible due to unanticipated circumstances, you must notify the probation officer within 72 hours of becoming aware of a change or expected change.
8. You must not communicate or interact with someone you know is engaged in criminal activity. If you know someone has been convicted of a felony, you must not knowingly communicate or interact with that person without first getting the permission of the probation officer.
9. If you are arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer, you must notify the probation officer within 72 hours.
10. You must not own, possess, or have access to a firearm, ammunition, destructive device, or dangerous weapon (i.e., anything that was designed, or was modified for, the specific purpose of causing bodily injury or death to another person such as nunchakus or tasers).
11. You must not act or make any agreement with a law enforcement agency to act as a confidential human source or informant without first getting the permission of the court.
12. If the probation officer determines that you pose a risk to another person (including an organization), the probation officer may require you to notify the person about the risk and you must comply with that instruction. The probation officer may contact the person and confirm that you have notified the person about the risk.
13. You must follow the instructions of the probation officer related to the conditions of supervision.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

- 1) You shall pay the outstanding AVAA assessment as ordered by the Court, and you must also notify the Court of any changes in economic circumstances that might affect the ability to pay the assessment.
- 2) You shall not incur new credit charges or open additional lines of credit without the approval of the probation officer, unless in compliance with the installment payment schedule.
- 3) You shall provide the probation office with access to any requested financial information.
- 4) You must not communicate, or otherwise interact, with the victim of the offense, either directly or through someone else, without first obtaining the permission of the probation officer.
- 5) You must allow the probation officer to install computer monitoring software on any computer (as defined in 18 U.S.C. § 1030(e)(1)) you use. To ensure compliance with the computer monitoring condition, you must allow the probation officer to conduct initial and periodic unannounced searches of any computers (as defined in 18 U.S.C. § 1030(e)(1)) subject to computer monitoring. These searches shall be conducted to determine whether the computer contains any prohibited data prior to installation of the monitoring software, whether the monitoring software is functioning effectively after its installation, and whether there have been attempts to circumvent the monitoring software after its installation. You must warn any other people who use these computers that the computers may be subject to searches pursuant to this condition. You shall contribute to the cost of monitoring in accordance with the probation office co-payment policy.
- 6) You are prohibited from using any Internet-capable device, or computer, including computers at businesses, private homes, libraries, schools, or other public locations, unless granted permission by the supervising U.S. Probation Officer.
- 7) You must not have direct contact with any child you know or reasonably should know to be under the age of 18, without the permission of the Court. If you do have any direct contact with any child, you know or reasonably should know to be under the age of 18, without the permission of the Court, you must report this contact to the probation office within 24 hours. Direct contact includes written communication, in-person communication, or physical contact. Direct contact does not include incidental contact during ordinary daily activities in public places.
- 8) You must not go to, or remain at, any place where you know children under the age of 18 are likely to be, including parks, schools, playgrounds, and childcare facilities.
- 9) You shall submit to a search, at any time, with or without a warrant, and by any law enforcement or probation officer, of the defendant's person and any property, house, residence, vehicle, papers, computer, other electronic communication or data storage devices or media and effects, upon reasonable suspicion concerning a violation of a condition of supervised release or unlawful conduct by the defendant, or by any probation officer in the lawful discharge of the officer's supervision functions.
- 10) At the direction of the supervising U.S. Probation Officer, you shall submit to polygraph examination(s), by a licensed polygraph examiner, as approved by the U.S. Probation Officer, and shall pay the cost of the examination.
- 11) You must participate in a sex offense-specific assessment. You shall contribute to the cost of the assessment in accordance with the probation office co-payment policy.
- 12) You shall participate in a program approved for the treatment and monitoring of sex offenders and contribute to the cost of treatment in accordance with the probation office co-payment policy.
- 13) You must submit to substance abuse testing to determine if you have used a prohibited substance. You must not attempt to obstruct or tamper with the testing methods.
- 14) You shall not possess, ingest, or otherwise use, a synthetic cannabinoid, or other synthetic narcotic, unless prescribed by a licensed medical practitioner for a legitimate medical purpose.

UNPUBLISHED ORDER

Before JONES, SMITH, and HIGGINSON, *Circuit Judges*.

PER CURIAM:

The Government moves to dismiss this appeal, seeking enforcement of the appeal waiver provision in Appellant Adreoinna Latoria Hickman’s plea agreement. Appellant opposes the motion but recognizes that her argument is “against Fifth Circuit precedent.” In doing so, she asks us to follow Judge Parker’s concurring opinion in *United States v. Melancon*, 972 F.2d 566, 570–80 (5th Cir. 1992) (Parker, J., concurring). We are bound by the majority opinion in that decision and cases since, which consistently hold

that valid appeal waivers like Hickman’s are enforceable. *See, e.g., id.* at 567–68 (majority opinion); *United States v. Higgins*, 739 F.3d 733, 736–39 (5th Cir. 2014). Thus, Hickman’s arguments are unavailing.

The Government’s opposed motion to dismiss the appeal is GRANTED, the Government’s alternative motion for summary affirmance is DENIED, and the appeal is DISMISSED.
