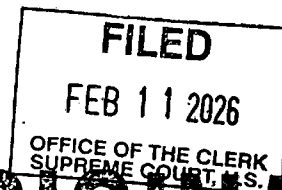

STATEMENT OF THE CASE

Introduction There appears to be several documents that are missing (alleged "distribution" check, tax/source documents to support the issuance of the alleged "distribution" check, TIGTA report for both cases, etc.)

I. Improper Service There appears to be improper service of all lower court orders.

A. Assertions All assertions by Jo Boyd appear to be inherently implausible.

B. Breach There appears to be a breach of fiduciary duty/contract by Jo Boyd.

C. Compliance There appears to be no compliance with the law due to breach of fiduciary duty/contract by Jo Boyd.

D. Damages There appears to be extreme damages to the petitioner, communities, and the country (the United States of America) due to breach of fiduciary duty by Jo Boyd.

REASONS FOR GRANTING THE PETITION

The petitioner is humbly and respectfully requesting that the Supreme Court of the United States restore the application/interpretation of law, due process, and access to justice to the lower courts as the leader of the judicial branch. The lower courts appear to be sanctioning breach of fiduciary duty/contract that has resulted in extreme damages to the petitioner, communities, and the country (the United States of America). All activity by the court appears to be perfectly consistent with the definition of "kangaroo court". The most alarming and shocking outcome appears to be the bypassing of investigators associated with the IRS.
