STATEMENT OF THE CASE

The U.S. Federal District Court, Columbia Division did not notify Defendants-Appellees of the lawsuit for Case No. 3:25-cv-07256-JDA that was based on U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity(hereafter USEEOC) Charge No. 436-2025-00781 seen as Notice Of Dismissal and Right To Sue Letter that authorized litigation in U.S. Federal Court because U.S. Federal Violations as stated. The Notice Of Dismissal and Right To Sue Letter by USEEOC was issued on June 30, 2025 based on a filed complaint as of June 23, 2025. U.S. Federal District Court, Columbia Division dismiss lawsuit without Judicial and Due Process which is egregious Judicial Misconduct due to Civil Rights Violations. The Stated Defendants-Appellees in a court's filing of Case No. 3:23-cv-4593-JDA-PJG at U.S. District Court, Columbia Division pleaded guilty on December 21, 2023 that it did take actions to deny employment opportunities and they were of the harm at No. X and No. XI therefore USEEOC Charge No. 436-2025-00781 filed was based Employment Discrimination and Retaliation. Defendants has intentionally denied since 2011 to Pro Se Plaintiff-Appellant that it did not take actions to prevent employment opportunities only to have this Plea as an Admission Of Guilt on December 21, 2023 seen in Case No. 3:23-cv-4593-JDA-PJG at U.S. Federal District Court, Columbia Division. Defendants-Appellees has participated in a substantial cover up by conspiracy to commit Obstruction Of Justice. And based on the plea of an Admission Of Guilt by Defendants-Appellees on December 21, 2023 in U.S. Federal District Court, Columbia Division that it did take actions to deny employment opportunities of therefore a complaint of Employment Discrimination and Retaliation was filed with USEEOC as Charge No. 436-2025-00781 which authorized a Claimant to bring a lawsuit in U.S. Federal District Court, Columbia Division for Civil Rights Violations as it was. This lawsuit was and is proper before the court based on a Plea of Admission Of Guilt by Defendants on December 21, 2023 in Case No. 3:23-cv-4593-JDA-PJG of denying employment opportunities and harm. Also an USEEOC Charge No. 436-2025-00781. And Pro Se Plaintiff-Appellant could bring lawsuit against an employer without a complaint filed with USEEOC for Civil Rights Violations. I as Pro Se Plaintiff-Appellant in Case No. 26-1087(3:25-cv-07256-JDA) has an Admission Of Guilt by Defendants-Appellees on December 21, 2023 per Case No. 3:23-cv-4593-JDA-PJG at U.S. Federal District Court, Columbia Division, an USEEOC Charge No. 436-2025-00781 was based on Admission Of Guilt by Defendants-Appellees as of December 21, 2023 and my U.S. Constitutional Rights therefore met or exceeded the standard as justification to bring lawsuit. I as Pro Se Plaintiff-Appellant declares Writ Of Certiorari is justified before this Supreme Court of the United States seeking proper Judicial Review and Adjudication.

REASONS FOR GRANTING THE PETITION

I as Pro Se Plaintiff-Appellant was denied Due Process required by the Fifth(5th) and Fourteenth(14th) Amendment regarding Civil Rights Violations because Defendants were never notified of lawsuit that was authorized by U.S. Employment Opportunity Commission(USEEOC) per USEEOC Charge No. 436-2025-00781 due to Case No. 26-1087(3:25-cv-07256-JDA) being dismiss unlawfully without proper Review and Adjudication. Also Civil Rights Violations established under Title VII. of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 regarding Employment Discrimination and Retaliation as stated in USEEOC Notice Of Dismissal with Right To Sue Letter for USEEOC Charge 436-2025-00781 dated June 30, 2025 that authorized litigation in U.S. Federal Court which is proper before this Supreme Court of the United States.

CONCLUSION

The petition for a writ of certiorari should be granted.
