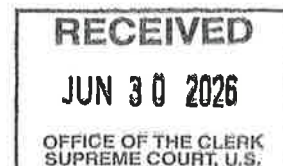

Litigant has had a lack of resources in Louisiana and lawyers had left litigant in complex litigation with no prior experience, a probono lawyer helped litigant in the 24th circuit of appeal but after that litigant was abandoned by the lawyer, litigant was left to fight a complex case by litigants self. Litigant had also petition the 5th circuit of appeal to appoint a court appointed attorney because of the complexity of her nursing case and it was denied, litigant was even ask to make an oral argument as if litigant went to law school, which was extremely unfair with all these top paid lawyers that litigant had to go up against, which was discriminatory litigant doesn't have all the knowledge as a lawyer but litigant proceeded on. Litigant had asked for court appointed attorney litigant she was denied. Litigant has been getting unfair treatment, denial of liberty and due process which are serious constitutional violations.

Applicant Natalie Henderson respectfully requests an extension of sixty (60) days within which to file a Petition for a Writ of Certiorari seeking review of the judgment of the Louisiana Supreme Court.

1. The Louisiana Supreme Court denied Applicant's writ application on April 9, 2026.
2. Under Rule 13 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of the United States, Applicant's Petition for a Writ of Certiorari is presently due on or about July 8, 2026.
3. Applicant respectfully requests that the time to file the Petition be extended for sixty (60) days, up to and including September 8, 2026.
4. This Application is made in good faith and not for purposes of delay.
5. Applicant is proceeding pro se following the loss of legal representation. Previously retained counsel ceased representation, requiring Applicant to continue complex administrative and appellate proceedings without formal legal training.
6. Applicant has been required to assemble and review an extensive administrative and appellate record spanning multiple years, including records from the Louisiana State Board of Practical Nurse Examiners, the Twenty-Fourth Judicial District Court, the Louisiana Fifth Circuit Court of Appeal, and the Louisiana Supreme Court.
7. Applicant is the primary caregiver for her autistic son and has experienced significant financial hardship during the pendency of these proceedings. Applicant has remained unemployed following the disciplinary action at issue, relies upon public transportation, and has faced increasing financial

strain, including the denial of anticipated SSI back-pay benefits for her child and the threat of utility disconnection.

8. Applicant has also experienced substantial emotional exhaustion associated with prolonged litigation and the loss of her professional livelihood. These circumstances have materially limited Applicant's ability to prepare a Petition adequately presenting the significant constitutional questions raised by this matter.
9. Additional time is necessary to organize the record, prepare the appendix, complete the in forma pauperis materials, and present the issues for this Court's review.
10. The Petition presents substantial constitutional questions concerning due process, evidentiary fairness in professional disciplinary proceedings, the treatment of healthcare professionals who report patient-safety concerns, and the effective deprivation of Applicant's ability to pursue her profession.

WHEREFORE, Applicant respectfully requests that this Court grant an extension of sixty (60) days, up to and including September 8, 2026, within which to file her Petition for a Writ of Certiorari.
