APPLICATION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE An application for a WRIT OF CERTIORARI/

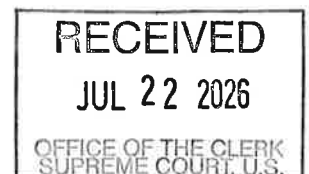

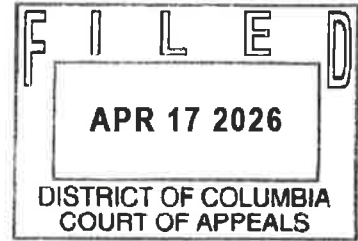

FURTHER ORDERED that appellant's petition for rehearing en banc is denied.

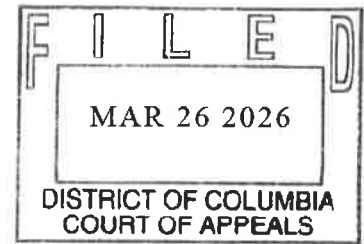

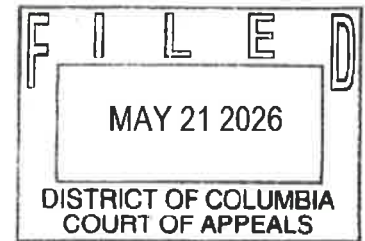
