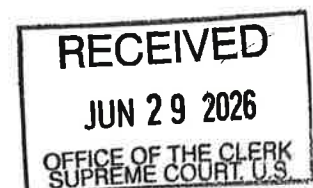

REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI

COMES NOW, the Petitioner, Jonathan Querisma, by and through undersigned counsel, and files this Request for Extension of Time to File Petition for Writ of Certiorari, and in support thereof, states as follows:

1. **Current Deadline:** The current deadline for filing the Petition for Writ of Certiorari June 29th. An order was filed from the Supreme Court of Georgia on March 31, 2026.
2. This is the first request for an extension of time requested by Jonathan Querisma in this matter.

4. **Prejudice:** Granting this brief extension will not cause undue prejudice to any party, nor is this motion made for the purposes of delay.
