## **Judicial Facts and Figures**

*Judicial Facts and Figures* is a set of <u>tables</u> containing historical caseload data primarily for the fiscal years 1990, 1995 and 2000 through 2005. All tables are in PDF. This publication includes data on the U.S. Courts of Appeals, the U.S. District Courts, and the U.S. Bankruptcy Courts.

The sources for the data were the <u>Annual Report of the Director</u>, the <u>Judicial Business of the United States Courts</u>, Federal Court Management Statistics and a few unpublished statistical tables. Specific data sources are noted on each table for easy reference. Except where specifically stated, data were compiled from the published report of the fiscal year noted (i.e., 1995 data are from the 1995 <u>Judicial Business of the U.S. Courts</u>). There have been minor revisions to some numbers in subsequent publications. For example, pending data are frequently revised in the subsequent publication. In addition, when the reporting period was changed in 1992 from the twelve month period ending June 30 to September 30, a number of filing totals for the previous years were revised in the <u>Judicial Business of the U.S. Courts</u>. Several tables in this report include data that reflect the revisions.

Judicial Facts and Figures does not offer an analysis of the federal caseload changes, although significant fluctuations in the data and corresponding explanations are noted on the tables. More detailed information can be found in the *Judicial Business of the U.S. Courts* for the year(s) in which the fluctuation(s) occurred. ## **FOOTNOTES**

- (1) Filings for recovery of defaulted student loans decreased from 1990 to 1995 due to a change in Department of Education (DOE) policy on collection of delinquent loans. Renewed growth peaked in 2000 as a result of streamlining of the loan processing system. In 2001, DOE implemented new administrative measures that caused fewer student loan cases to be filed in federal courts, as reflected in the 88% drop in these cases.
- (2) Filings for recovery of overpayments of veterans benefits have decreased significantly as the Department of Veterans Affairs has used administrative actions and the Internal Revenue Service to recover overpayments rather than filing suit in district court. For additional information, see the 1991 Annual Report of the Director, page 86.
- (3) The increase in personal injury filings between 1990 and 1995 was mostly attributable to breast implant cases and a large number of oil refinery cases filed in the Middle District of Louisiana. In 2002, personal injury product liability filings more than tripled due to a large number of plaintiffs seeking relief in the expectation that new laws may be enacted making it more difficult to file cases related to injuries involving asbestos. A significant increase in filings involving plaintiffs seeking relief due to the injurious side effects of the anti-cholesterol drug Baycol also contributed to the increase. The 58 percent increase in personal injury product liability filings in 2004 resulted from the transfer of several thousand cases to the Northern District of Ohio as part of multidistrict litigation involving welding products that contained manganese. In addition, a number of district courts experienced an influx of cases related to multidistrict litigation involving either Baycol or Phentermine\Penfluramine\Dexfenfluramine (Fen-phen).
- (4) Civil rights filings increased significantly after 1990 largely because of the Civil Rights Act of 1991 and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. Filings in all categories of civil rights were down in 2005, resulting in a 10 percent decline from 2004.
- (5) Social security filings peaked in 2002 due to a change in the processing of backlogged cases by the Social Security Administration, but have since declined slightly. For additional information, see the 1997 Annual Report of the Director, pages 16 and 17.
- (6) In 2004, approximately 20,000 filings related to one case in the U.S. Bankruptcy Court for the District of South Carolina.
