Pardon, to my taking any unnecessary step relative to suggesting the names of persons to office, the Battalion ~~and~~ ^{of the} ~~Artillery~~ ^{Infantry} and Engineers, in an act for the better organization of the troops, of the U.S. and for other purposes, helped the P. of Congress with. I thought it convenient to submit to the attorney general for his opinion the matter. The second copy of his answer.

The 1st or 2nd of January consider
"an office created during the session of the Congress,
and not filled by appointment, but, by and with
the advice and consent of the Senate, and
is any happening during the session, which the
President cannot fill, during the recess, by the
powers vested in him by the constitution, and
a legislative act of Congress ~~shall~~ ^{shall} remain vacant.
This legislative act was passed on the 3^d of March
1799 intitled 'an act authorizing the President
& the U.S. to fill certain vacancies in the army
and navy' for the expences. These powers
embraces all offices in the ~~service~~ ^{service}
