Standardized Testing Policy

Results from scholastic exams are an important criteria for evaluating our global pool of applicants. With that said, NYU has one of the most flexible testing policies of any college or univers ty.

You only have to subm t results from one of the following:

- SAT Reasoning Test (https://sat.collegeboard.org/home) (writing test and opt onal essay not required)
- ACT (http://www.actstudent.org/) (writing test not required)
- Three <u>SAT Subject Test (https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/sat)</u> scores
- Three AP exam (https://apstudent.collegeboard.org/home) scores
- International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma (http://www.ibo.org/)
- Three IB higher-level exam (http://www.ibo.org/) scores if not an IB Diploma candidate
- Nationally accredited exam (http://www.nyu.edu/content/nyu/en/admissions/undergraduate-admissions/how-to-apply/all-freshmenapplicants/instructions/standardized-tests/nat onal-examinations.html) that shows you completed your secondary education

W th flexibility comes considerat ons. Here are a few quest ons you might be asking:

Should I submit results from the current or new SAT test?

E ther are fine. We accept results from the current test or the new test, which will be offered starting March 2016 (https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/).

I've taken more than one standardized test. Which scores do I submit to NYU?

We only require that you take one test so submit the results that best improve your chances for admission. Here are some other things to remember:

- If you've taken the SAT more than once, you can select which results you want to send to us using Score Choice (http://professionals.collegeboard.com/testing/sat-reasoning/scores/policy). We only review the highest Cr t cal Reading, Math, and Writing scores you submit, regardless of test dates, creating the highest possible compos te "superscore." Please note that if you submit scores from the new and current versions of the SAT, the scores cannot be combined into a "superscore."
- For the ACT, we focus our evaluation on the composite score of your indiv dual subject score results (with or without the wr ting test).
- Only subm t multiple test types if you want us to review specific results from each.

Which subject test results do you want to see?

If you choose to subm t three SAT subject tests to fulfill the standardized testing requirement, we want to see one score from each of the following:

- Literature or human ties
- Test of your choosing in any subject (View the Standardized Testing Categories in the right column)

Note: Some of our schools have their own requirements for subject test results:

- The Stern School of Business requires one of the subject exams be in math.
- The Tandon School of Engineering requires one literature or human ties score, one math score, and one science score.

How do I submit my test results to NYU?

The testing organization should send your scores to NYU. If this is not possible, then have a school official submit them. NYU's school codes are as follows:

- SAT, SAT Subject Test, AP, and TOEFL: 2562
- ACT: 2838

What if my test results won't be available by the application deadline because of a delay or other reason?

SAT, SAT Subject, ACT, and AP tests only need to be taken by the application deadline; t's OK if final results aren't available by the application deadline. However, we do need to receive off cial SAT or ACT scores before making an admissions offer.

If your results are delayed (because of the testing agency or natural disaster resulting in school closings), you can self-report your scores by emailing a screenshot of them to us. This might expedite our review of your applicat on.

"Predicted scores" for other tests, such as IB and A Levels, can be submitted using one of the following methods:

· Through the Common Applicat on website; or

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- Mailed on official school letterhead in a sealed and signed envelope; or
- Emailed from a clearly dentifiable school email address; or
- Submitted using the NYU Predicted Results Form (http://www.nyu.edu/content/dam/nyu/ugAdmiss ons/documents/Predicted%20Score%20Submission% 20Form.pdf) (have a school off cial do this).

Note: NYU has the right to withdraw an offer of admission if your final test scores are not w thin an acceptable range of your predicted results.

Does NYU recognize test results from other countries?

We sure do. Here's a list of approved tests. (http://www.nyu.edu/content/nyu/en/admissions/undergraduate-admissions/how-to-apply/all-freshmenapplicants/instructions/standardized-tests/nat onal-examinations.html) The test must meet the following cr teria:

- It shows you completed your secondary education;
- It was administered by an independent body (not your school); and
- It was approved by NYU.
