



BIRTHS

The number of births a population has each year is an important indicator of population growth, which can impact health systems, policy decisions and the economy.¹ A fertility rate is the number of babies born to women of childbearing age in a given population. Sustained low fertility rates may indicate that the population is aging; sustained high fertility rates may predict a younger population.


DATA FOR IDAHO



- In 2022, there were 22,391 live births in Idaho.
- The fertility rate in Idaho in 2022 was 58.4 per 1,000 women ages 15-44.
- Of all live births in Idaho during 2020-2022 (average), 17.2% were Hispanic, 76.4% were White, 1.2% were Black, 1.0% were American Indian/Alaska Native and 1.9% were Asian/Pacific Islander.
