Dear Special Master Lancaster:

The United States has received notice that a hearing on the State of Georgia's motion to dismiss for failure to join the United States as a party has been set for June 2, 2015, in Washington, D.C., with each party provided one hour to present argument. As you are aware, the United States filed a brief as amicus curiae in opposition to that motion. The United States respectfully requests that it be permitted to appear and present argument as amicus curiae at the hearing on Georgia's motion to dismiss. We have conferred with the State of Florida, and it has agreed that the United States may use 20 minutes of Florida's allocated time to present argument as amicus curiae. We have also conferred with the State of Georgia, and Georgia does not oppose this request.

We also reviewed the transcript of the last status conference, and note that at the beginning of conference you asked whether a representative for the United States was present. As you are aware, we have asked in our Statement of Participation to be allowed to attend status conferences, but that request remains pending, and the Case Management Plan provides that "[o]nly parties may participate in status conferences and other case proceedings." We apologize for any misunderstanding about our attendance at that conference, and reiterate our request that the Case Management Plan be amended to allow the United States to attend status conferences.
