

Report of Boundary Commissioner and recommendation
entry of stipulation decree filed on June 11, 1970

This Court on February 21, 1970, 307 U.S. 481, having entered a decree and appointed a Boundary Commissioner to survey the boundary between Arkansas and Tennessee and recommend to that decree the said Commissioner having filed a "Report on Commission to Survey" in which he sets forth the General Location and Specific Location of such boundary to which the parties have assented and accepted.

It is now the duty of the Court to enter a decree that such boundary shall be left as follows:

General Location

The entire boundary line between Arkansas and Mississippi is located between the Mississippi River, Arkansas, and Shelby County, Tennessee. It is a line which runs in a North-South line and is more correctly called the "Arkansas Line". The line is located in the State of Tennessee and is generally known as the "Arkansas Line". It includes 35° 30' N. 35° 45' N. and longitude 90° 15' and 90° 10', and is more particularly defined as follows:

Specific Location

Beginning at a point designated as Station No. 1, which point is 3° 34' E. at 1,354.0 feet from Mississippi River Commission Permanent Bench Mark "Neudan" whose coordinates are, latitude 35° 02' plus 1,355.76 feet, and longitude 90° 15' plus 1,014.42 feet.
