**MOTION OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS THAT ITS
PETITION FOR TEMPORARY MODIFICATION OF
DECREE BE DECIDED SEPARATELY FROM THE
MOTION OF THE METROPOLITAN SANITARY DIS-
TRICT OF GREATER CHICAGO FOR CLARIFICA-
TION OF THE DECREE.**

Illinois' motion for temporary modification of this Court's
decree of April 21, 1935, so as to authorize diversion of
water in an amount not exceeding 10,000 cubic feet per

second, presented in view of the urgent and critical emergency described in that motion, is now pending before this Court.

Answers to that petition by the parties are due on or before December 7, 1956.

The Metropolitan Sanitary District of Greater Chicago, one of the parties to this cause, has filed a motion for clarification of the decree.

It is unnecessary to decide simultaneously the motion of the Metropolitan Sanitary District of Greater Chicago in conjunction with decision of Illinois' petition for temporary modification. Illinois desires that this Court's consideration of the Sanitary District's motion do not delay decision of this Court on the emergency petition.

WHEREFORE, Illinois respectfully moves that this Court consider her petition for emergency relief as soon after December 7, 1956, as is possible, Illinois again emphasizing the urgent nature of her application for temporary relief.
