**MOTION OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN TO DISMISS
THE MOTION OF THE METROPOLITAN SANITARY
DISTRICT OF GREATER CHICAGO FOR CLARIFICATION
OF THE DECREE OF APRIL 21, 1930**

To the Honorable

The Chief Justice and Associate Justices
of the United States:

Comes now the State of Wisconsin by Vernon W. Thomson, Attorney General, and Roy G. Tulane, Assistant Attorney General, and moves this Court to dismiss with costs the petition of the State of Illinois for a temporary modification of paragraph 3 of the decree of April 21, 1930, as amended, upon the following grounds:

1. The decree of April 21, 1930, on May 22, 1933, is clear and unambiguous and requires no interpretation or clarification.

2. The Metropolitan Sanitary District of Greater Chicago has no interest in the maintenance of navigation on the Mississippi River.

3. Under date of October 23, 1950 a similar request by the petitioner, joined at that time by the State of Illinois, for clarification of the decree of April 21, 1930 was dismissed by this Honorable Court. 340 U. S. 858, 95 L. ed 628.
