SUGGESTION OF CHANGE IN NAME OF DEFENDANT SANITARY DISTRICT OF CHICAGO.

THE METROPOLITAN SANITARY DISTRICT OF GREATER CHICAGO respectfully suggests to the Court that the General Assembly of the State of Illinois, by an Act approved

June 30, 1955 (L. 1955, p. 677; Ill. Rev. Stat. 1959, Chap. 42, Sec. 322), authorized the Board of Trustees of the Sanitary District of Chicago, by ordinance and public notice, to change its name without impairing the legal status of acts theretofore performed by the district.

Pursuant to said Act, the Sanitary District of Chicago, a defendant herein, by an ordinance adopted on October 13, 1955 [Journal of Proceedings, p. 677], after due public notice, changed its name from the Sanitary District of Chicago to The Metropolitan Sanitary District of Greater Chicago.

Wherefore, this defendant, formerly the Sanitary District of Chicago, suggests to the Court that hereafter it be identified in these causes as The Metropolitan Sanitary District of Greater Chicago and that henceforth it be so named as a party defendant herein.

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
