Statement of the State of Nevada Relative to Present Perfected Rights in Compliance with Article VI of the Decree of March 9, 1964.

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A search of the official records of the State of Nevada fails to reveal the existence of rights to water from the main stream of the Colorado River perfected prior to June 25, 1929, with the exception of three rights heretofore extinquished by purchase by the United States Bureau of Reclamation as part of the acquisition of lands underlying Lake Mojave. The State of Nevada therefore advises the Court and the Secretary of the Interior that no present perfected rights are asserted on behalf of this State.

No attempt is made to list rights relating to federal establishments under the assumption that this prerogative rests with the Secretary of the Interior.
