Exhibits highlighting the Court's history are located throughout the ground floor. Also on view are select portraits of the Justices.



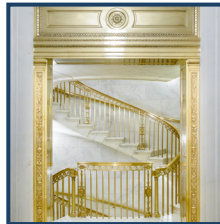
### JOHN MARSHALL STATUE

This ground floor landmark pays tribute to the nation's longest serving Chief Justice, who served for 34 years from 1801–1835.



### SPIRAL STAIRCASES

Tucked in the side corridors on the ground floor are two architectural marvels designed by the building's architect, Cass Gilbert.



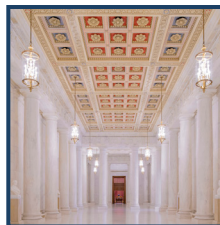
### COURTROOM

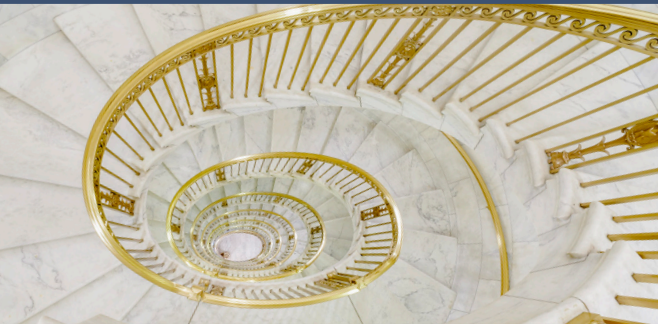

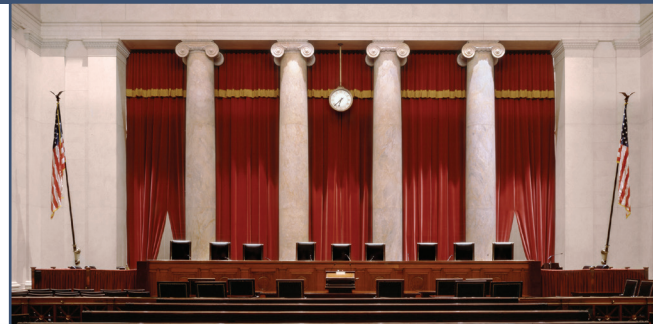

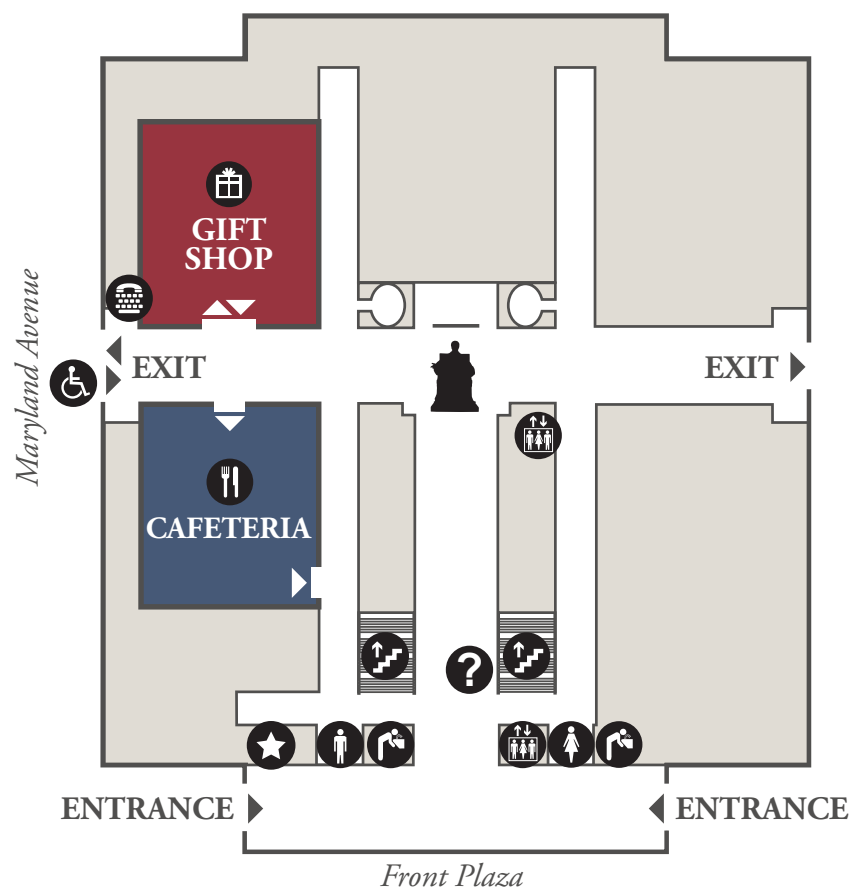
