#### JOHN MARSHALL STATUE

This ground floor landmark pays tribute to the nation's longest serving Chief Justice, who served for 34 years from 1801-1835.



#### Spiral Staircases

Tucked in the side corridors on the ground floor are two architectural marvels designed by the building's architect, Cass Gilbert.



#### Courtroom

Situated at the center of the first floor, the Justices meet in the Courtroom to hear oral argument and announce decisions.






